





ICBF Weekly Update 2nd March 2012



2 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 587,753 with the number of animals weaned at 505.258.
- ♣ Distribution of the 5 Year Trend report has continued this week to all Suckler Scheme participants along with a Suckler Cow 'Milk and Docility' survey. Farmers will also receive their annual supply of freepost Animal Events envelopes.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 505,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 110,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.58% BVD PI Positive rate.
- ♣ Pilot testing is continuing on the new 'Bull-Tracker' report for pedigree herds.
- ♣ A weight recording report is under development at the moment, which will be distributed to farmers involved in weight recording after each submission of weights.
- Some further developments to further enhance the loading of genotype information to the database is continuing.
- ♣ The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2012compared with 2011.



3 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ A new genomic run was completed this week with just over 700 dairy animals receiving a genomic EBI.
- The February beef evaluation results for animals linear scored between January 16th and February 15th is nearing completion and will be uploaded to the database early next week.
- ♣ Extracts have commenced for the next routine big evaluation for all dairy and beef traits.




