



2 ICBF Strategic Plan

- ♣ Consultations with the Highfield based ICBF team took place this week.
- ♣ The key priorities identified in these discussions included:
 - Research on a wide range of opportunities to improve the accuracy of the dairy and beef genetic
 evaluations by using new data collected through the suckler cow welfare scheme and using
 improved methods to extract more information from the available data.
 - o Developing systems for providing EBI's using genomic data on young bulls (and cows) that are potentially valuable to Irish farmers.
 - Expansion of the HerdPlus® to more dairy and beef herds while also improving the quality of the service.
- A draft plan will be finalized over the next two weeks for consideration by the ICBF Board at its October meeting.

3 Database





- ♣ 502,712 inseminations have been received so far in 2008, compared with 351,495 in 2007 for the same period.
- ♣ The work on revamping the AI software for next season is continuing. This week we met with the Munster and Dovea groups.
- ♣ The number of calves with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 370,000.
- ♣ The new development work on the Bull Search output is being finalised and will be tested next week.
- Next week, an upgrade of the web-server infrastructure will take place, which will help provide a more resilient system.

The revamp of the Milk Recording system continues, with the work focused on the back-end. Once this piece of work is completed, we will engage with the milk recording organisations in terms of how screens/functionality etc will need to be updated to take account of their needs.

4 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Work continues on improvements/enhancements to various aspects of the dairy and beef evaluations.
- We are still awaiting a file of French linear proofs to incorporate into the linear evaluation.

International Beef Evaluations

- Ongoing work on updating the foreign pedigrees in the database searching primarily for country of origin & original tag in that country.
- ♣ Update of cross reference files for both the Interbeef and the Hereford projects: +3,000 Charolais & Limousine animals, and +60 Hereford. Both pure breed across country evaluations will start this fall in collaboration with the Interbeef center in Sweden and the Animal Genetics and Breeding Unit (AGBU) in Australia.

5 Sheep

- The recommendations in relation to the use of NSIS for sheep breeding have been the subject of discussions with DAFF.
- ♣ There is a plan within DAFF to replace the current NSIS ID system with a different numbering system based on the use of electronic tags.



- ♣ A proposal to use a bolus with electronic identification as an interim solution is being evaluated.
- ♣ A meeting has been scheduled to consider these identification issues further in advance of the next meeting of the Interim Sheep Board.
- There has been a good response from producer groups interested in participating as MALP flocks. An alternative of moving rams rather than ewes (as in the original proposal) is being considered.
