2. ICBF Board Meeting

At the Board meeting on Thursday:

- Michael John O'Donovan joined the Board as one of the three appointments made by the Milk Recording members of ICBF. He replaces Benny Cottrell.
- Financial projections for 2009 and the budget for 2010 were adopted.
- The outcome of the Dairy Breeding Consultation meeting held on 5th November was discussed. Any changes implemented following the consultation meeting next week (9th December) will be reported to the Board for ratification.
- The possibility of a Beef Breeding Conference to be held early in the new year, along similar lines to next weeks Dairy Breeding Conference, is to be examined.

3. Sheep Ireland Board Meeting

- Financial projections for 2009 and the budget for 2010 were adopted.

- A major sheep industry day is being planned for June 2010. Sheep Ireland is actively participating in the planning along with Teagasc, UCD and other interests.

4. Breeding Industry Award – Dr. Ignatius Byrne

- On Thursday this week the Boards of ICBF and Sheep Ireland participated in recognising the major contribution that Dr Ignatius Bryne has made to cattle and sheep breeding in Ireland. He was awarded the inaugural Breeding Industry Award in recognition of these contributions.
- While Senior Inspector with DAFF, Ignatius provided active leadership to the breeding industry and played an very important role in ensuring the resolution of issues impacting on the partnership that is so essential for rapid genetic progress. His positive no-nonsense style in combination with a sympathetic ear has helped ensure our industry has been able to achieve so much over the last ten years.
- Ignatius has been a key contributor to the development of Sheep breeding in Ireland and served as the first chairman of the board of Sheep Ireland.
- In accepting the award Ignatius complimented the breeding industry on the progress it has made and indicated that it is well placed to take advantage of the new genomic technologies.

All suckler scheme herds with a calving in 2009 have now received their first pre-weaning form. The number of 2009 born calves with meal introduced is 525,000, with the number of animals weaned at 353,000.

The systems upgrade last weekend was successful. This week, we have been tidying up some loose ends, and working with the various organisations to help smooth the transition.









All four milk recording organisations are working well on the new Milk Recording system. We are continuing to update the software based on feedback from the organisations.





- There a number of projects currently being finalised. The AI Code application is now in test mode, and the final changes are being made to the Sheep application for Sheep Ireland.
- The work on the 5 Year Trend report has been completed and will be launched at the Cattle Breeding Event next Thursday.
- The graph herewith shows Inseminations recoded on AI Handhelds in 2009 compared with 2008.



8. Genetic Evaluations

- A document outlining the new evaluation for beef linear type has been circulated to the herdbooks for feedback ahead of releasing this to all breeders interested in linear scoring for 2010.
- Work continues on the new fertility evaluation. The matrix containing all the genetic correlations between the new traits has been assembled and work now begins on a test run in MIX99.

9. G€N€IR€LAND®

Beef

- Sign ups are going well with 286 herds taking part in the autumn/winter program so far.
- We have now passed our target of 700 G€N€IR€LAND[®] herds for 2009.
- The Charolais bull CWB has become the 8th Charolais bull to be fully tested and the highest index bull to be tested.
