




- 4 The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 437,130 with the number of animals weaned at 188,862.
- Around 4,500 herds have already completed their Dairy Efficiency Programme (DEP) health recording requirements for 2011. There are around 6,500 herds in the DEP.
 Al Handheld Serves 2011 v 2010
- Testing continues on the prototype of a new cattle weighing scales with blue-tooth integration to ICBF handheld software. We are dealing with the testing issues as they arise.
- Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the upcoming national BVD eradication programme.
- The loading of the high density beef genotype files to the ICBF database is on-going.

4 Sheep Ireland

- This week has primarily involved communicating with a number of different societies in relation to the upcoming lambing season and our hopes to get more pedigree breeders signed up for 2012. There are a number of events approaching in the coming weeks where Sheep Ireland will be trying to illustrate to breed societies the potential benefits of our LambPlus service. We have been invited to speak at a number AGMs and this will present a great opportunity to educate breeders on a wider scale.
- We are beginning to get new breeders signing up already for the coming year; we will continue to engage with interested breeders and societies to increase the level of participation. In order for us to accelerate the rate of pedigree breeders joining the scheme, it is clear that we will need a multi-facetted approach. Sheep Ireland will continue to attend as many events as possible to promote LambPlus. Society representatives will also play a key role in the process to help our message reach non-recording breeders, as part of this we hope to make contact with all non-recording breeders in coming weeks.
- ↓ There are a number of LambPlus breeders who firmly acknowledge the potential of the €uro-Star evaluations and these have been actively promoting the scheme among other breeders, and this has been delivering great results. The work that Teagasc has been doing over the course of the year has also led to a mind-set change among many breeders. The challenge is now to turn this positive mind-set into active recording breeders who are in time going to deliver more profitable rams to the Irish sheep industry. We must keep in mind that this is the objective, the sustainability and future viability of the industry depends on it.

5 Genetic Evaluations

- New test evaluations for dairy fertility, maternal milk, and calving were distributed during the week. Feedback on the proofs is welcomed. Presentations on the maternal milk and calving were given at the herd book technical meeting held on Tuesday.
