3. Sheep Ireland - MALP Meetings

On Thursday we held meetings with the flock owners participating in the MALP scheme. A copy of the presentation discussed at these meetings is available in the publications section of <u>www.sheep.ie</u>.

The MALP flocks were established two years ago primarily to demonstrate the contribution that genetics can make to improve the profitability of sheep production. Each flock has undertaken extensive performance recording and already the benefits of high merit rams (5 star) over low merit rams (1 star) on lamb growth rates has been clearly demonstrated as illustrated in this table:

In 2011 information on maternal traits will increase dramatically when the ewe lambs born in 2009 themselves are lambing and rearing lambs.

The MALP flocks are clearly demonstrating the benefits of performance based sheep breeding. The focus is now moving to help breeders participate fully in performance recording and to promoting the financial benefits of using high €uro-Star index rams.

4. Al Code Process

- **4** The new web based 'AI Code Application' system commenced on Monday the 1st November 2010.
- 4 It replaces the old paper based system that ICBF has been operating since 1999.
- **4** The new system:







- Involves the relevant Breed Society at the beginning of the process in order to ensure that the Bull's details are correct on the ICBF database.
- o Enables applicants to apply for and receive AI Codes over the web.
- Monday also heralded the end of the old DAF AI Code MS Access database that had been used to generate the AI Codes. AI Codes were entered twice, once into the old DAF system and once into the ICBF Database. This duplication has now been removed with AI Codes being entered only into the ICBF database.
- \$,901 AI Codes have been issued to-date. 3,732 of these have been issued by ICBF since it became involved in the AI Code process in December 1999.


- ↓ There are 154 herds signed up to the Autumn programme, taking a total of 4,400 straws.
