









4 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 287,546, with the number of animals weaned at 56.589.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 583,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 441,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.62% BVD Virus Positive rate.
- ♣ Good progress has been made around the design of the Beef HerdPlus outputs to incorporate the new Euro-Star indexes, and the development work on these is underway.
- Updates to the weight recording software are on-going, with some work completed this week in relation to dairy heifer weighing.
- The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2012 compared with 2011.



5 Sheep Ireland

- ♣ This week we visited the students of Clonakilty Agricultural college, to promote the benefits of the Sheep €uro-Stars. Our Agricultural colleges will be a big target for us from this point forward as these young students will be the ones most likely to adopt new and exciting developments such as the €uro-Stars and indeed flock performance recording on their own farms going forward. We plan to visit all the colleges in the coming weeks and will circulate material such as information boards for display in the college sheep shed units.
- Ur CPT is now kicking into full swing with the majority of rams collected and settled into their new home for the next three weeks in UCD, Lyons Estate. Rams will be trained to give semen for the purposes of AI by the newly established Sirebank team. Sirebank is a new breeding service which has been set-up by UCD in Lyons Estate. It will provide services to Irish sheep farmers to fertility test rams and where requested to freeze semen for future use. The development of the service is a fantastic development and will without doubt contribute very positively to genetic gain in the future, when the €uro-Stars become more widely adopted and we begin identifying more and more top genetic merit breeding lines.
- UCD are currently carrying out research on the various effects that ewe body condition score can have on performance and ewe output, and they hope to incorporate the 2000+ ewes that are currently involved in the CPT programme to help their study. This will simply involve the condition scoring of the CPT ewes at various times from breeding onwards and assessing the subsequent performance of these ewes. This is a hugely interesting study and should show some interesting results. The Teagasc better farm programme up to now has really highlighted the importance of correct ewe condition at crucial points of the year especially pre-mating and the considerable effect this can have on output. The collection of this information from the CPT flocks







should not place any extra inconvenience on anyone involved so it's a great idea to include these flocks as they are a hugely valuable source of information.

7 Genetic Evaluations

- 4 A new beef linear evaluation has been completed and uploaded to the database.
- Estimation of genetic parameters for calving, gestation, mortality and maternal calving are progressing and will be completed shortly. Once finished a new genetic evaluation will be done and test proofs sent to the industry for feedback.

8 Tully Test Centre – Launch of Beef Breeding event 10th November

The launch of the ICBF/FBD Beef Breeding Event took place on Tuesday of this week at the G€N€IR€LAND Progeny Test Center, Tully, Co. Kildare. The aim of the launch is to highlight the up-coming beef breeding event at Tully on **Saturday**, 10th **November 2012**. The launch was well attended with a large numbers of farmers and industry representatives present.

The event will provide Irish beef farmers with a wealth of information on the latest developments in beef breeding. On the day, ICBF will outline the new role of Tully in breed development. The first group of $G \in \mathbb{N} \in IR \in \mathbb{L}$ AND progeny under the new Tully regime will be on display. These animals will have their test nearly completed and will be slaughtered soon after the event. Information will also be available on the new $G \in \mathbb{N} \in IR \in \mathbb{L}$ AND Maternal beef breeding program and the new beef \mathbb{C} iro-Star indexes. There will also be live demonstrations of the new ICBF weight recording service, along with information on HerdPlus and GROW.







Chairman of FBD, Michael Berkery also announced the winners of the Beef G€N€IR€LAND awards. In total 18 awards were made to herd owners, with 12 of these in recognition of excellent herd data recording in the G€N€ IR€LAND progeny test and 6 to breeders of bulls that excelled in the G€N€IR€LAND beef breeding program. Speaking at the presentation of the awards, Michael said "improved profitability in beef cattle production depends on bull breeders who make the right selection decisions and on high quality performance data from progeny test herds. These awards are made to highlight these two very important aspects of ICBF's beef breeding initiatives".

Herds were selected for the data recording award based on their ability to record the required information on the progeny of the $G \in \mathbb{N} \in \mathbb{R}$ ability used in their herd. This information helps achieve high levels of reliability on the $G \in \mathbb{N} \in \mathbb{R}$ bulls for terminal and maternal traits. The bull breeding awards were made to the breeders of the top bulls graduating from the beef $G \in \mathbb{N} \in \mathbb{R}$ program, based on the new Terminal $\in \mathbb{N}$ and the new Maternal $\in \mathbb{N}$ reliability for key traits within each index.






