

#### 2. Database



- 17,655 inseminations have been received so far in 2009, compared with 18,158 in 2008 for the same period.
- 4 The AI 2009 software migration with PG was postponed until next week due to the weather.
- The Animal Events notebooks continue to go out and should be completed by the end of next week. There also continues to be a lot of activity in relation to the 2008 born calves. The number of calves with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 736,000, with just over 632,000 of these having been weaned.
- The revamp of the Milk Recording system continues. Programming has continued this week, and will take several weeks to complete.
- Work on the in-breeding check function and Sire Advice 2009 are continuing, with the in-breeding check in the testing phase.
- This week, work has continued on the Sheep application, with a continuous stream of good feedback from users, which is being incorporated wherever possible.

#### 3. Genetic Evaluations

#### Dairy

Due to problems encountered with some samples at the genotyping lab the release of the proofs for Genomically Selected bulls will not now happen on Monday February 16<sup>th</sup>. We had expected to receive them this week but







this has been postponed by at least 1 week. Further information will be made available in next weeks update and at the dairy industry meeting on the  $19^{th}$ .

#### **Dairy & Beef**

Work is on-going in terms of various research projects, the outcomes of which will enhance the evaluations over the next year or two. Currently, the work is focusing on the best methods for incorporating heterosis and recombination, definition of breed groups, beef docility, calving, and incorporation of foreign data into evaluations.

#### International

Work has been done in identifying foreign animals in the Irish database for the Simmental and Belgian Blue beef breeds. The objective was to create files of animals with proofs in the United Kingdom. This work has been conducted with the relevant breed society in Ireland and the Pedigree Cattle Breeding Services in the UK. Two files of 795 and 574 animals were created for the Simmental and Belgian blue breeds respectively. The foreign proofs of the matching animals between the Irish and the UK databases will be integrated in the next beef genetic evaluation along with the French proofs for the continental breeds and the UK proofs for the Limousine and the Aberdeen Angus.


## 4. Tully

#### Dairy

Calls to participants of last years programme commenced this week. Sign-up forms still being received at a steady rate.



- Total number of doses requested to date is 12,815. Breed breakdown: Pure Fr 1,109; HOFR 9,252; XBred 1,826; and Mixed 628.
- Payments were made this week for the milk recorded heifers from the Spring 2005 programme and for calvings from Autumn 2007.

  - o 75 were in the PSBIP 2008 program.
- 4 New Flock owners that were not in the PSBIP program in 2008 may join Lambplus
  - It is important to remember however that as we currently do not have any data for these flock owners (no PSBIP data & no Flock book data), they will have to enter their entire flock details either through the web or by paper.
  - The flock data required would be NSIS tag numbers, Tattoo numbers, Date of Birth, Sex, Sire & Dam information.

## 7. GROW – Linear Scoring & Weight Recording



- **u** The new GROW report is awaiting final development work to be completed on it.
- 4 It will then be sent out to all breeders following a visit from a Scorer.
- Crucially, it will show a Breeder how many of the animals that they put forward for scoring & weighing will have their own data included in their evaluations.
  - This will depend on: 1. Age 150-300 days is desired age window

- 4 A constant issue following a Scoring session is that a Breeder assumes that all data recorded is subsequently used in genetic evaluations. This is not always the case, however up to now this has not been clearly communicated to Breeders. The new GROW report will address this issue.
