







2 Database







- ► The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 630,197 with the number of animals weaned at 565,196.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 572,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around

409,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.60% BVD Virus Positive rate.

- 4 A major referencing session for the Linear Scorers was held on Wednesday of this week.
- 4 29 cattle were scored in the morning and rescored in the afternoon.
- Analysis of the data is currently underway.

5 Sheep Ireland

- Last Saturday Sheep Ireland was present at Sheep 2012 in Athenry. Despite the inclement weather there was a huge crowd in attendance. There were contributions in some form or another from all industry stakeholders, including information seminars, practical management workshops, commercial exhibitors, shearing and wool demonstrations, cooking demonstrations and pedigree breed society national championships.
- From Sheep Irelands point of view this was a fantastic opportunity to educate sheep stakeholders as to benefits of our breed improvement programme. In association with Noirin McHugh (Teagasc) we presented the sheep Ireland breeding programme and some results to date. We also took part in the breeding workshop which demonstrated to those present the best practice to adhere to when selecting a ram for breeding. These workshops ran on an hourly basis and attracted great audiences throughout the day.
- ♣ Overall it was very evident that more and more commercial farmers are becoming aware of the potential of the €uro-Stars. We spoke with people who were aware of the programme but wanted to learn more but equally important we spoke with people that were completely new to the concept. One thing is for certain that demand for recorded rams continues to grow and Sheep 2012 has contributed to this trend immensely.

6 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Monthly beef mini evaluation results will be available next week.
- Work is ongoing on a project to identify the key areas of labor requirements within dairy herds with a view to identify bulls whose daughters require less labor. We hope to survey a broad range of dairy farmers in coming weeks as the next part of this research project.
