



2. Database






- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2009 born calves with meal introduced is 627,131 with the number of animals weaned at 557,978.
- The usage of the new VET infrastructure is picking up. All Vets who were already using the ICBF system have been migrated to the new infrastructure. Any Vets



Beef Packs

This week we sent each a breeding pack to some 3,000 HerdPlus Beef clients. The pack contains 3 reports, namely;

Euro-Star Report - every beef animal with a sire gets a suckler beef value (€value) and a star rating (All females and pedigree males).

Genetic Evaluations are run 3 times per year after which each animals rating is updated. Use this report to see the genetic strengths and weaknesses in the herd.

Suckler Cow Report - Performance history for each cow in the herd, one page per cow, showing all her calving history and how the calves killed out with weights and grades if applicable – important for breeding/culling decisions.

Slaughter Report - NEW! - Tracks herd slaughter performance. ICBF gets the carcass grades and weights data from the factories and abattoirs and computes a "Lifetime €uros per day" measurement for each animal – based on price divided by age. The report is broken down into 5 sections (where applicable):

1. Steer

2. Young Bulls

3. Heifers

4. Cows

5. Bulls

HerdPlus Web Tools

As well as HerdPlus reports there are many HerdPlus Applications available to our Beef clients on our website www.icbf.com.

Using their personal password* each HerdPlus client has access to the following tools;

<u>Stock/Nitrates Report</u> – you can enter dates and just click run - takes the pain out of generating stock no's.

<u>InBreeding Tool</u> – enter stock bull no., the program does inbreeding check, flags any cows too close to breed.

<u>Slaughter Report</u> - you can enter missing slaughter data & re run on line for whatever period you wish.

<u>Calving Report</u> – Track your mortality, calving interval, etc.

<u>Suckler Cow Welfare Scheme</u> – enter data & check on line if your records are up to date for the scheme

* If any client forgets their password they can text the word PASS to 51101 and we will text them their HerdPlus log-on and password.

5. Tully

On Monday last, 3^{rd} of May, the sale of the 105 bulls, that were performance tested through the Tully G \in N \in IR \in LAND program was held at Tully Test Centre, Kildare, Co. Kildare. Bulls on sale were accredited with a high health status and had feed intake and performance test information on key profit traits such feed efficiency and growth rate available to purchasers on the day.

A large crowd attended with over 800 catalogues handed out at the event. There were bulls from 9 different breeds on offer with a high clearance rate of 64% achieved on the day. The Charolais Champion bull, Lisgree Elite Et, owned by James Geoghegan, Rosemount, Co. Westmeath was sold prior to the sale to NCBC for €14000 (See picture below). The sale attracted a lot of interest from N. Ireland and over-seas, with 6 bulls purchased by Northern breeders and 5 being exported to the UK.

Next intake:

Bloods taken on-farm for the next intake are coming in at a steady rate and are being sent to Backweston laboratories for analysis. It is hoped to have the final on-farm testing completed by Wednesday of next week. This will allow time for samples to be analysed before bulls enter isolation at Tully on Saturday, 22^{nd} of May. The facilities at Tully and off-farm isolation unit are being power-washed and disinfected at present in preparation for the up-coming intake.
