3 National Dairy Cattle Breeding Day

- ♣ Preparations for this important event on Thursday 13th November are progressing.
- ♣ The cattle breeding industry (AI, Herd Books and Milk Recording) will be well represented with trade stands.
- The day will be in two parts. The morning session (10:30 to 12:30) is for participants in G€N€ IR€LAND® and the afternoon (14:00 to 15:30) is an open session existing and potentially new HerdPlus® dairy clients.
- **4** G€N€IR€LAND® herds involved in the supply of young elite bulls and in the progeny testing of these bulls will be updated on plans for 2009 and the impact of genomics on Ireland's breeding program for dairy cattle.

- ♣ Sheep Ireland's recording and information service for flock owners has been named **LambPlus**. The key elements of this service include:








- Web based with flock owner accessing the Sheep Ireland database directly from a home computer
- Recording of matings, births, weights, faecal egg counts, scanning, dags
- Genetic evaluation reports
- Other management reports
- Help desk support
- Payment by direct debit
- Base fee of €60 (inc VAT) per flock per year (for any number of sheep) with optional services (scanning, paper & postage, faecal egg counts, DNA testing etc) costing extra.
- On Thursday we met with representatives of Flock Books to consult on their involvement. A copy of our presentation is in the publications section of www.sheep.ie. The Sheep Flock Books now have a few months to consult with their members, obtain clarifications and to decide if they wish to avail of the comprehensive recording and information service being offered by Sheep Ireland.
- → DAFF have approved the Sheep Ireland identification system for use in flocks participating in our sheep breeding information service (**LambPlus**). A copy of the letter from Sheep Ireland to DAFF outlining the details of the scheme is in the publications section of www.sheep.ie. The key elements for new born animals are:
 - Left ear NSIS
 - Right ear NSIS
 - Lost tags replaced with same ID
 - Movement to another participating flock retain both tags, no new tag
 - Movement to non-participating flock new owners tag in right ear
- The recording protocols for migrating animals from PSBIP to LambPlus are nearing completion.

5 Database





- **★** 508,670 inseminations have been received so far in 2008, compared with 357,936 in 2007 for the same period.
- The work on revamping the AI software for next season is continuing. A number of training sessions of support staff within the organisations took place this week.
- The number of calves with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 575,000, with just over 250,000 of these having been weaned.

- Some work on the catalogue functions for herd-books is being finalised which should increase the efficiency of that process by making the process more 'self-service' for Herdbook staff.
- The revamp of the Milk Recording system continues. The 'back-end' work will be completed next week, and the focus will switch to the design of the screens for inputting and data correction.
- ♣ This week, work has continued on migrating the Sheep Performance system to the Sheep Ireland database.

6 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ All evaluations are now completed and are currently being uploaded to the database.
- ♣ We will be in touch with the industry next week regarding the timeline for official publication.
- ♣ The run represent the final run for 2008 and includes updated domestic information for both dairy and beef animals.
