






1. Important Dates






- → The 2009 Suckler Scheme calvings are continuing at a solid rate. In relation to 2008 born calves, the number of calves with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 768,000, with just over 674,000 of these having been weaned.
- The revamp of the Milk Recording system continues. Testing has continued this week, and it is envisaged that there are about another 2 weeks of testing left. Parallel runs on some Munster Milk Recording herds began this week and will continue next week. PG

- Work on a new mechanism of sending and receiving Suckler scheme data to DAFF is beginning and will take a number of weeks to complete.

2. HerdPlus

Breeding Charts

Breeding charts were dispatched to some 3,650 dairy farmers this week. Farmers who ran the Sire Advice will have their bull selections reflected on their Breeding Charts. The bulls also get automatically saved to the AI Handhelds operated by AI technicians. Next week we will provide final update on the most popular bulls selected by HerdPlus Sire Advice clients.

Genomics and Active Bull Lists

- ♣ Some 13,300 information packs were sent out this week to inform the greater population of dairy farmers (not just HerdPlus) on the new science that is Genomics.
- ♣ Information and explanatory guides on AI, Genomic selection, and the New Active Bull list were included in the pack. Making genomically selected bulls available to Irish farmers in 2009, provides a great opportunity to improve the genetics of the national herd and thereby improve profits for every dairy farmer who avails of these bulls.

3. Genetic Evaluations

Beef

- The active bull list for Beef AI sires was published in the Irish Farmers Journal this week. The list is also available on the ICBF website.
- Evaluations on the next routine beef evaluation have been completed and are in the process of being uploaded to the database.
- With the publication of new docility proofs in this weeks Active Bull list based on a joint evaluation of the Animal Welfare farmer recorded docility and the linear scorer docility, focus will now change to evaluating the Animal Welfare calf quality trait. Genetic parameter estimation (to estimate heritability) has begun and following this the genetic relationship with the traits in the routine beef evaluation will commence.

Dairy

Uploading of the latest dairy proofs has commenced. Initial indications are that the correlations with the old proofs are very high. We expect to have proofs available for **proven** AI bulls early next week.

Genomic Update

♣ DNA extraction is almost complete. The genotyping is expected to commence on Monday 13th April in Denmark with genotypes expected back at the end of the week. The genomic selection software will then be run to get genomic figures for these bulls. At this point all Genomically Selected bulls will have their proofs updated.

4. Lambplus®

The 40-Day Weight Recording Screen was released for use on the Lambplus website last week.



- o Feedback was received on this screen Order of the lamb tags and Number of lambs being displayed will now be acted upon.
- Another day of training for the Donegal FRS Scanning team was performed in Ballyhaise Ag College.
 - The Handheld unit that will be used to retrieve the data was tested. Improvements to this device are currently being progressed.
 - A final day of training is planned for Monday the 20th of April. After this a number of Flocks will be due to commence scanning.
- Another round of telephone calls will be made shortly to ensure that all lambs have been entered onto the system in advance of the scanning visit. Without the lambs having been entered onto the system the Handheld unit will not have any lambs and so the visit will not be able to take place.
- Completed Lambing & Mating Recording sheets for Flockowners signed up to the 'Paper' service continue to be sent in for keying.




- The first order of EID tags for the first MALP Flock have been used. The Pratley handling unit was fitted with the EID reader and lambs were put through the system on Tuesday. It worked well and was a useful exercise as slight adjustments will be made to the equipment for the next day.
