1 Important Dates

ICBF Board meeting. 29th March.

2 Meeting with Tully Bull Owners

The meeting held with the owners of bulls currently at Tully on Wednesday night was well attended. Prof Simon More made a presentation on IBR and the outbreak of the virus at Tully. The key points in his presentation covered the short incubation period of the virus making an isolation strategy unlikely to be effective, the risk of false negatives in bulls entering Tully and the possibility of the virus coming from biosecurity breaches. Prof More and Dr Doreen Corridan responded to a wide range of questions and statements.

A proposal for resolving the outstanding issues was put to the meeting by the Chairman of ICBF Mr John O'Sullivan. This was discussed and is the basis on ongoing consideration by the interested parties.

3 Board Meeting

The Board meeting on Thursday was focused primarily on the current situation with IBR at Tully.

The Board adopted the financial analysis of the beef and dairy breeding scheme proposals as the basis for seeking financial support for the 2007 dairy and beef programs and asked that proposals be bought back to the Board for the 2008 programs in the near future.

- ♣ TB and brucellosis testing of the December intake will take place on the 13-3-07.

5 International Beef Evaluations

Thierry Pabiou and Ross Evans are attending the inaugural Interbeef workshop. They will be making presentations on the Irish Beef genetic evaluations and also the Interbeef work that has been completed thus far. The aim of the workshop is to gather people from other countries who are interested in participating in international evaluations for beef animals. A report on the workshop will be in next weeks update.






7 HerdPlus


- ♣ Herd sign-up is going well with 280 herds now involved in this years programme.
