2 G€N€IR€LAND[®]

REVIEW

Over the last few weeks we have completed a review of the process for selecting herds to participate in the $G \in \mathbb{N} \in IR \in \mathbb{L}AND^{\otimes}$ dairy progeny test. This review has concluded that immediate priority should be given to:

- 4 Ensuring the dams of the test bulls are the very best that are available in Ireland, and
- 4 The test bull semen is delivered in good time for use in the breeding season.

With these issues addressed the G€N€IR€LAND[®] progeny test is a very attractive option for those dairy farmers who keep good records and are interested in playing a leading role in dairy breeding.

G€N€IR€LAND[®] DAIRY FARMER MEETING

An open farmer meeting to discuss $G \in \mathbb{N} \in \mathbb{R} \oplus \mathbb{A} \setminus \mathbb{D}^{\otimes}$ will be held on Wednesday 28th November at Horse & Jockey. The meeting will consider the procurement of bulls and their progeny testing in Ireland. This will be a good opportunity for herd owners to discuss their expectations of the Irish dairy breeding programs and to hear about plans for achieving optimal rates of genetic gain in Ireland.

Details of the program will be finalized next week and invitations will be sent to all herds participating in dairy HerdPlus[®] and the G \in N \in IR \in LAND[®] dairy progeny test.

DAIRY AUTUMN 2007

There are now 116 herds signed up, taking a total of 4,351 doses.

BEEF SPRING 2007

We are in the process of getting payments organised for the Beef spring programme. Initial analysis of the straws dispatched in the spring shows we have a 45% return rate in relation to recorded inseminations. Work will be done over the coming weeks to contact these farmers to ensure they get their insemination data entered onto the database.

4 Genetic Evaluations


Extracts are underway for the next routine INTERBULL evaluations for production, health, fertility and survival.





- Work continues on improvements to the pedigree file for routine genetic evaluations including the full recuperation of all known breed information. This will then be tested on the dairy calving interval and survival evaluation and reported back in due course.
- A new round of mart data collection for the beef genetic evaluation has commenced. ICBF personnel will visit marts over the coming weeks.

5 Database Update



- 357,776 inseminations have been received so far on the AI Handhelds in 2007, compared with 158,360 in 2006 for the same period.
- ↓ Extracts for the next Interbull genetic evaluation run have been completed from the database.
- Updates to the Dairy Calving report have been on-going this week.
- Preparations are continuing in order to be ready for the commencement of the Suckler Cow Welfare Scheme. Developments and changes to a number of screens are underway.
- ↓ Work is continuing on the Sire Advice module for the new season.
- The implementation of the new hardware solution and database upgrade is on-going. The testing of the milk recording element has been completed this week.


