2 More Achievements

This week, like many weeks in the history of ICBF, has seen two major achievements.

- 1. HerdPlus reached 1,000 signed-up herds. It was only in mid September that HerdPlus was launched. The service was introduced primarily to achieve cost savings for ICBF while at the same time ensuring a high quality service for those farmers that wanted it. Well done to the HerdPlus team and to all who have provided support for this important industry initiative. We now look forward to achieving 2,000 herds signed-up!
- 2. The beef industry got a first glimpse of the complete set of the new beef indexes. Andrew Cromie, speaking at the Irish Grasslands Assn beef conference, gave an insight into the new indexes and the way they will enable beef farmers to identify the most profitable animals to use for breeding suckler replacements. Both of these achievements rely primarily on the availability of a wide range of data collected from farms and many other sources. When this data is combined using the best available scientific methods it becomes information that cattle farmers can use to become more profitable by making better management and breeding decisions. This ultimately is the purpose of ICBF.

Beef


♣ The latest evaluation including the current intake of Tully bulls is nearing completion. These evaluations will be available in the catalogue for the Tully bulls early next week.

Feedback from the Irish Simmental Society on the list of animals used in both Ireland and the UK has been received. Conversion equation work will be undertaken in the coming weeks.




- ♣ The numbers signed to HerdPlus passed the 1,000 number this week.

- Linear scoring system for use in the herds participating in the TEAGASC Norwegian Red research is now in operation.




