







- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 228,376 with the number of animals weaned at 24,915.
- ♣ Work is continuing on the design of the new catalogue service for both beef and dairy animals.

- The Dairy Replacements discussion group report has been completed and will be live next week.
- ♣ A development update to the Beef Slaughter report will begin next week.
- ♣ The initial design of a new infrastructure to manage genotypes at ICBF is well under way.
- ♣ The migration of the Teagasc advisor application to a new infrastructure should be completed next week. This will standardise how Teagasc, Vets, private consultants, etc access the ICBF database.
- ♣ The new 2009/2010 Beef Calving reports are available this week.
- Work on a new infrastructure for communicating with marts is on-going, with a view to getting the data flows on a more efficient and effective basis.

3. Crookstown and Damer Discussion Groups host EBI€100 Open Days

● Over 2000 farmers attended this weeks EBI€100 Discussion Group Open days, which were held on the farms of Liam Leahy, Cookstown, Co. Cork (on behalf of the Crookstown group) and Padraig Hyland, Ballacolla, Co. Laois (on behalf of the Damer group). Both groups were joint winners of this EBI€100 competition.

- The objective of the competition is to identify the farmers and groups that are using cattle breeding to maximise profit on their farms. Over 70 groups entered the competition, with the winning groups selected on key parameters such as; (i) herd EBI, (ii) young-stock EBI, (iii) number of AI-bred dairy replacements, (iv) milk solids output/hectare, (v) herd fertility and (vi) farm profit (based on Teagasc profit monitor data).
- It is now almost 10 years since the EBI was first introduced and one of the stands that generated most interest at both events was a comparison of the top 20% and bottom 20% EBI cows on the Damer and Crookstown farms. The analysis was based on cows calving on these farms between 2004 and 2007, with comparisons based on milk solids and fertility performance over the first 3 lactations. On both sets of farms, the high EBI cows outperformed the low EBI cows by on average 70kg F+P per lactation, 20 days calving interval and 30% survival to 4th lactation. This is a compelling endorsement of EBI as it is based on almost 3000 records from 34 commercial dairy farms. If anyone had any doubts about the benefits of selecting on the basis of EBI, they were quickly dispelled on the day! A more complete analysis of the data is attached with this update (for the Crookstown Group and will be in the publications section of www.icbf.com for the Damer group on Monday. Photographs of both winning groups are below.


