






- **4** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 451,366 with the number of animals weaned at 222,579.
- Around 5,400 herds have already completed their Dairy Efficiency Programme (DEP) health recording requirements for 2011. There are around 6,500 herds in the DEP.
- Testing continues on the prototype of a new cattle weighing scales with blue-tooth integration to ICBF handheld software.
 We are dealing with the testing issues as they arise.
- The link that allows a farmer to upload a 'Tru-test' weight file is now live.
- ♣ Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the up-coming national BVD eradication programme.
- The loading of the high density beef genotype files to the ICBF database is on-going.

- **4** There are 88 herds signed up to the programme so far taking a total of 2,915 straws.
- Straws were allocated to 17 herd owners this week and will continue to be allocated to the remainder of the herds on a daily basis.

4 Sheep Ireland

- Next Wednesday 16th November, Sheep Ireland will be in attendance at one of Teagasc's regional sheep meetings. The venue is the Clanree Hotel, Letterkenny and the event is due to commence at 8.00pm. We have sent out invitations for the event to all pedigree breeders in the region. Donegal is unique in the fact that there are a huge number of pedigree breeders within the county. Approximately 25% of Irish pedigree Texel breeders are located there. Other breeds, particularly Suffolk are also very prominent. We hope that breeders will attend the meeting on the night.
- In relation to the €uro-Stars and how they are formulated, there is a huge element of scepticism in the industry, based primarily on poor information received from misinformed sources. At any event that Sheep Ireland have attended in the past, we find that breeders who listen and gain a true understanding of how the €uro-Stars work, become advocates of the system. The problem that Sheep Ireland currently has is that it is extremely difficult to reach all pedigree breeders. The situation is changing however, and the more events that we attend, the more progress we can make. The work that Teagasc advisors and researchers have been doing throughout the year has also had a dramatic effect in terms of removing many of the misconceptions that exist. So we urge pedigree breeders to attend, if not with the intention of joining our recording service, at least to learn the accurate details about the €uro-Star evaluation system.
- In the coming weeks we will continue with our attempts to enrol more breeders into LambPlus. There has been a good response to date, with a high level of enthusiasm around the €uro-Stars and their future potential. The bottom line is, the more breeders involved the more progress the industry as a whole can make.

5 Genetic Evaluations

- ✤ Work on a new test run for maternal weaning weight is nearing completion. Results will be circulated next week ahead of the industry meetings.
- Work has also commenced on the analysis and possible integration of the farmer scored cow docility into the routine docility evaluation. Initial results indicate a heritability similar to weanling docility and a positive correlation with weaning docility.
