


2 Change in our phone numbers

- **♣** 521,247 inseminations have been received so far in 2008, compared with 370,615 in 2007 for the same period.
- The work on revamping the AI software for next season is continuing. Testing in the field continued this week, with good feedback being received. The plan is that the testing will continue over the Christmas period, and that the organisations will go live on the new software in January.
- There continues to be a lot of activity in the Suckler Scheme. The number of calves with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 685,000, with just over 520,000 of these having been weaned.
- The revamp of the Milk Recording system continues. Work on the data inputting screens has continued this week.
- This week, work has continued on building the systems to handle the flock reconciliation activities which are already under way in some flocks. Useful feedback has been received from those who have begun to use the application, and that feedback is being incorporated.

5 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Data has been sent to Interbull this week for the next routine evaluation which will form the basis of the Spring 09 dairy proofs for foreign bulls. Domestic proofs will be updated in early Jan (see below).
- → The cut-off date for including data in the next routine evaluation is December 18th. A new evaluation will commence in early January with publication of proofs available in early February. An exact date of publication will be given here in mid-late January.
- Work is on-going in the development of conversion equations for calving difficulty for foreign dairy bulls. This is an interim solution to provide information on these bulls for Spring 09 in advance of partaking in the Interbull test-run for calving traits.
