







- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 459,768 with the number of animals weaned at 257,114.
- **4** The developments required to support the EBI discussion group competition have been completed.
- The design of a new infrastructure to manage genotypes at ICBF is continuing. The building phase has begun, and this development is expected to be completed before Christmas.
- ♣ A revised linear scoring evaluation report for beef animals has been released and the first of the reports are being generated today.
- The work on a new infrastructure for communicating with marts is now complete and data processing has begun.
- Some further updates to the beef and dairy catalogue functionality have been completed and we will be in touch with all beef herdbooks next week.
- The generation of the Herdplus packs to support the spring calving season has begun.

4. Genetic Evaluations

- **Extracts** for the next routine evaluation are done and evaluations have commenced. Progress on these will be updated over the next few weeks.
- ♣ An update on changes to the various evaluations will be presented at the industry meetings next week.

5. Tully

- 4 On-farm inspections of bulls entered for the up-coming Tully intake were completed on Friday, 5th of November, with a total of 275 bulls inspected. 170 bulls passed the on-farm assessment, which gives a pass rate of 62%. This is similar to the pass rate of 64% for the previous autumn intake.
- Breeders whose bulls have passed the on-farm inspection can now carry out on-farm health testing. All health testing information, which included the list of animals required for blood sampling was sent out by post last week, to both the bull owner and their Veterinary surgeon. A number of bloods have already been received and these are being sent to Backweston in Cellbridge for analysis. Blood samples are being tested for IBR, BVD, Johne's and EBL. Breeders have until Friday 19th of November to take the samples from the listed animals on their farm. All bulls that pass the health testing criteria should be in isolation at Tully by the end of the month.
- ♣ Preparation of facilities at Tully is near completion with all sheds and out door facilities power washed. Also, selected areas such as the weighting shed have been disinfected.
