





ICBF Weekly Update 14th December 2012

1 Important Dates


- Interim Sheep Board Meeting Deferred until January...

2 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 537,838 with the number of animals weaned at 432,400.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 480,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.62% BVD Virus Positive rate.
- Good progress continues around the design of the Beef HerdPlus outputs to incorporate the new Euro-Star indexes, and the development work on these is continuing.
- ♣ The 2013 Dairy personalised notebooks continue to be generated and printed. The distribution of these will begin next week.
- Weight recording figures this week were at 1,044 animals, from 975 the previous week. We also had 553 DIY weights recorded by farmers this week.
- ♣ The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2012compared with 2011.



3 Sheep Ireland

- This week was another busy one as Sheep Ireland finalised our latest round of national meetings. We held evening meetings in Fermoy, Tullamore & Kilkenny. Certainly the atmosphere at all of these meetings was generally very positive, recognising the potential of a strong breeding programme for Ireland's sheep industry.
- It was made very clear however that a strong breeding programme structure will not succeed without the awareness and adoption of genetic evaluation information by the wider industry. There were many non-recording pedigree breeders in attendance over the three nights and this is encouraging for 2013. We now need to stimulate stronger interest from the ram buyer.







There was some great suggestions made over the course of all our meetings in recent weeks and we will do all in our power to act on these in the coming months. We would like to thank all those who attended for their time and active participation in discussions.

4 Genetic Evaluations

Routine evaluations are currently on-going and proofs are being loaded to the database. Changes to calving and beef evaluation will be implemented in this run. Genomic evaluations are also underway. Official publication is Friday 21st December.


