



2 Breeding Consultation Meetings – Thursday 14th April

- ♣ The meeting on Thursday was well attended 65 people representing all aspects of the cattle industry.
- Highlights of the meeting included:
 - O Completion of research on genomic evaluations for Linear Type traits and for Friesians. This is expected to be implemented later in 2011.
 - o Further progress on fertility evaluations for beef and dairy. Enhanced evaluations will be the subject of test runs over the summer with a plan to implement in the autumn.
 - A presentation of the initial results of a comprehensive review of beef breeding including the outcome of the Grow review. These findings will be discussed further with the industry before final decisions are taken.

- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 594,684 with the number of animals weaned at 519,033.
- A new initiative with Farm Relief Services (FRS) will kick off in the coming weeks whereby hoof-care operators will use handhelds to record the visit data and farmers will subsequently receive reports generated from the ICBF database.



- Testing on a new authorisation module for farmers and their service providers is on-going. This will give farmers more flexibility and control in providing
 - authorisation to others to see their data. The intention is to have this live at the end of April.
- The first batch of the new 'Sire Error' forms will be sent out early next week.
- ♣ Work is on-going in establishing electronic links to the commercial animal health laboratories. The first files were received this week.
- ♣ Updates to the catalogues, with particular focus on the dairy catalogues are now completed and will be rolled out next week.

5 Tully

This week saw the champion beef bulls selected from each of the main breeds that participated in the latest Tully intake. All bulls at Tully completed their 90 day performance tests on the 4th April. Now that the test has been completed, bulls will have their concentrate offering gradually decreased leading up to the sale, to ensure they are acclimatised to their new on-farm environment. The champion bulls are a reflection of the exceptional quality of bulls available for purchase at the upcoming sale. They achieved excellent performance figures, for instance average daily gain ranged from 2.0 to 2.6 kg per day, across breeds. Also, all champion bulls have excellent star ratings for Suckler Beef value, with 5 bulls in the top 1% of their respective breed. All measurements at Tully are incorporated in the €iro-Star indexes to give more accurate genetic evaluations

whilst also increasing the reliability on key production traits. All bulls at Tully boost a high health status as they are tested free of IBR, BVD, Johne's, EBL, TB and Brucellosis.

- The Champion bulls (Table 1) were identified within each breed based on 3 main criteria. These criteria were visual assessment (33%), €uro-Star indexes (33%) and Tully performance data (33%).
- These bulls (pictured below) will be among the 96 offered up for sale at Tully on Monday, 25th April, which consists of 24 Limousins, 28 Charolais, 17 Angus, 1 Aubrac, 4 Belgium Blues, 3 Herefords, 2 Blonde d'Aquitaine, 7 Salers and 10 Simmentals. The sale is located minutes from Kildare town, exit 13 of the M7 motorway. For more information or a copy of the catalogue, contact Stephen or Niall on 045 521573.
