
2 Collaboration with UCD



- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 623,073 with the number of animals weaned at 558,528.
- ♣ A more efficient mechanism for the batching of suckler forms being distributed to farmers has now been completed.







- ♣ A number of updates continue to be made to the weight recording screens and outputs.
- Some revisions to the herd-book on-line functionality are now live. The particular focus is on the breakdown of the milk and fertility Eurostar figures.
- ♣ Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the up-coming national BVD eradication programme.
- ♣ Some further work on the screens to support the transfer of genotypes to and from the ICBF database is ongoing.
- Next week, the work begins on a major upgrade to one of the key software platforms used at ICBF. The tool used to generate our farmer forms and reports, (Streamserve), will undergo a major upgrade over the coming months.
- ♣ The graph below compares the AI technician activity on dairy cows in 2011 vs. 2010 by breed of bull used.
