2 Al Promotion 2006

- There were two more Workshops this week. One in Blarney attended by 86 people and one in Sligo attended by 45. Feedback has been very positive. The final five workshops take place next week.
- The content of the workshops has been modified to take less time and now includes a break-out session focused on actions to take in 2006 in order to reverse the decline in AI. Some of the suggestions coming from these sessions include:
 - o Provide all farmers with a two page synopsis of the workshops.
 - o Provide all farmers in a region with the contact details for technicians servicing their area.
 - o Provide more high EBI bulls.
 - o Encourage herds to start AI earlier and to use it for longer.
 - o Provide heat detection aids as part of the AI service.
 - o Once-a-day insemination should be the norm.






- Only register stock bulls with a high EBI.
- Communicate more with farmers wives.
- o Large public relations job needs to be undertaken.
- o Advertise more.
- o We must have a consistent message to farmers.
- ♣ A beef advertisement has been prepared and will start appearing next week. A copy of this is attached.
- ♣ Preparation for the Mart Events is proceeding. A launch based around one of the high EBI calves on offer took place this week.
- 4 Advertising in 21 Marts for the month of April is being organized. This media has only recently come to our attention and offers considerable potential for contacting farmers who do not come to more formal meetings.

3 Database Update

- ♣ 80 new herds added to the database last week.
- The next two weeks are critical in terms of rolling out the AI handhelds. The training has been completed and the software is proving to be very solid. The organisations are busy trying to get as many herds signed up as possible, and as usual, getting the last 25% completed is proving to be difficult, but the relevant organisations, along with ICBF, are putting in a big effort.
- Development work to support the back end activities of the AI handheld are continuing, including reporting, and billing functions.
- ♣ The new SCC herd health report has been completed and a copy of the report is attached. This will be available on the website as each milk recording test is completed. It should prove to be another valuable tool in





helping farmers deal with the SCC issues they face.

- ☐ The generation of the dairy EBI reports has begun today and they will be issued throughout next week.
- ♣ The development of Fertility Reports for the coming AI season is continuing.
- In preparation for the upcoming mart sales of high EBI young-stock, application forms for entry into those sales have been issued. Attached is a sample.

4 Tully

- ♣ All the Bulls have moved out to their respective herds following the Sale on 4th March
- Preparations are underway for the next intake in May
- ♣ A Group of Agricultural Students from Roscrea will visit on Tuesday

5 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ The ICBF Active Dairy Bull List (Spring 2006) was completed this week and posted on the website.
- Queries relating to individual bulls (EBI's and/or reliabilities) were dealt with for a number of AI companies. In addition a number of beef linear BLUP queries were handled for a number of beef breed societies.
- ♣ Preparation for another run of beef proofs has commenced, including updated genetic parameters and some additional data. It is anticipated that these proofs will be made available ahead of the release of the ICBF Active Beef Bull List (6th April, Irish Farmers Journal).
- ♣ Preparation of pedigree & performance data for international evaluations has been completed for the Limousin breed and forwarded to INRA for international evaluations.

6 G€N€IR€LAND - Dairy

- Work on the recruiting of herds for the G€N€IR€LAND dairy program is continuing with some 300 herds now signed up.
- ♣ Semen is currently being dispatched to participating herd-owners. To-date some 10 bulls have been dispatched (70 herd-owners) from a total of 53 bulls due for progeny testing this Spring.

As part of the collaborative effort to "Breed future profits", ICBF and the AI industry have scheduled a series of mart-based events which will include; (i) trade-stand displays, (ii) an information forum and (iii) a special consignment sale of high EBI heifers. - Born between 1st January 2005 & 1st May 2005 (bulling heifers) or born after 1st January 2006 (heifer calves).
- Progeny of an Al sire.
- Minimum EBI of 50 EURO.
- Holstein Friesian (pedigree or non-pedigree)

Would you be interested to consigning animals to these special sales? If so, then please tick the animals you would like to enter on the attached listing, together with the sale that you would like to consign the animals to and return using the Freeport envelope provided. Closing date for receipt of these applications is **Friday 31st March 2006**. Please note that animals do not need to be halter-trained for entry to the sale.

As part of the initiative, <u>Intervet</u> and <u>Pfizer Animal Health</u> have kindly agreed to co-sponsor the events. A total prize fund of 17,500EURO has been offered (3,500 EURO per event), which will be allocated as follows*;

- 1st prize 2,000 EURO Group of 3 females (calves and/or bulling females) with the highest group average EBI.
- 2nd prize 1,000 EURO Group of 3 females (calves and/or bulling heifers) with the second highest group average EBI.
- 3rd prize 500 EURO Group of 3 females (calves and/or bulling heifers) with the third highest group average EBI.

This is an exciting new initiative for Irish dairy farmers and the dairy industry. Its objectives are two-fold; (i) to promote the benefits of AI and EBI ("breeding future profits") and (ii) to reward those farmers that have been following a breeding program focused on profitability.

It is anticipated that these events, will soon become the "local cattle breeding event of the year". I look forward to seeing you at one of the events, either as an exhibitor or as a spectator on the day and wish you every continued success in your breeding program in the future. 


