
2 Meeting with Breed Assns and representatives of Tully Bull Owners 12th March


- The meeting on Monday resulted in agreement on the basis for resolving the current difficulties arising from the presence of IBR at Tully.

- ♣ The use of the Sire Advice program is on-going. 400 herds have now run the Sire Advice programme. We are introducing a change next week which will allow farmers to enter a different set of bulls for the cows and for the heifers.

5 International Beef Evaluations

Interbull workshop dedicated to international beef evaluation – Paris – 9 & 10 march 2007

The sub-committee of ICAR, Interbull, in charge of international evaluations had set up a workshop dedicated to international beef evaluation last week in Paris. About 50 persons from different countries (France, Ireland, United Kingdom, Germany, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Italy, Switzerland, Poland, Hungary, Czech Republic, Morocco, The United States, Canada & New Zealand) attended the meeting.

- 1. On the first day of the workshop different presentations were made:
 - Beef recording and national beef evaluation in different countries: UK, Ireland, France, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Czech Republic and New-Zealand.
 - Genetic improvement in the Irish suckler beef herd: industry expectation & experience so far' by Ross Evans.
 - The Interbeef experience so far:
 - 'Review of research on beef international genetic evaluations' by Eric Venot (INRA SGQA

 France)
 - o 'Data exchange for international beef genetic evaluations' by Thierry Pabiou
- 2. The second day was dedicated to group discussion to outline the future work of InterBeef. The main outcomes were:
 - **Traits:** currently working on weaning weight, the general consensus was to move to carcass related traits, other live traits and calving traits
 - **Breed:** all the participants agreed that the main breeds to work with in regards to connexion between the countries should be Limousine & Charolais. The other breed considered could be Simmental.
 - **Organisation:** InterBeef would be based in Sweden; to facilitate data management, web based applications would be created with a strict protocol of security.

To summarise: the InterBeef project has been very well perceived by the participants of the workshop. The actual international evaluation between France, Ireland & the UK will be extended to the Scandinavian countries in a near future.

- ♣ Reminder €40 FBD direct debit offer closes this weekend, Mar 16th.




