#### 2. ICBF Board

At its meeting on Thursday the ICBF Board:

- 4 Appointed James Lynch to replace Liam Foley on the Audit & Finance Sub-Committee.
- ♣ Endorsed the actions and decisions arising from the breeding consultation meetings held on July 21<sup>st</sup> 2010.
- ♣ Discussed the review of GROW<sup>®</sup>. Terms of reference are currently being discussed with stakeholders and the issues under consideration include:
  - 1. Accuracy, completeness and relevance of weight and linear score data,
  - 2. range of traits,
  - 3. service costs and service income,
  - 4. customer needs,
  - 5. best practise for ensuring accurate data for genetic evaluations, and
  - 6. best practise for breeders supplying stock bull & AI bulls.
- ♣ Considered a progress report on IGenoP and agreed that priority should be given to ensuring the international competitiveness of the Irish breeding and farming industry.
- Welcomed progress on the development of genomic services in collaboration with IHFA and Weatherbys.

David has investigated the potential of a Sheep Ireland service to identify the best matings accounting for inbreeding and genetic merit, using the Belclare breed as a case study.





### 4. Sheep Ireland

- Weighing and condition scoring of MALP ewes is about to begin.
- ♣ Intake of rams into isolation unit for the 2010 CPT breeding season begins next week.
- LambPlus breeders who have mating completed on farm should submit the data to avoid errors and reduce the recording workload at a later stage.
- The Belclare Breed Society is 100% involved in Sheep Ireland with all breeders recording in the scheme. The Society is holding sales on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September in Kilkenny Mart and Athenry Mart. On Friday 24<sup>th</sup> September a sale is being held in Ballinrobe Mart. All sheep in the catalogues will have €uro-Stars.
- ♣ Sheep Ireland's has a stand in the Sheep Tunnel at the Ploughing Championships. The stand is located at Row R Stand Number 533.
- This week Graham Potterton reported on the potential for sheep information services



Graham has been focusing on the lamb producer groups and exploring the potential for Sheep Ireland to provide information services of value to these farmers. His report identifies three potential services: ram locator, on-farm recording and lamb slaughter information.

#### 5. Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 270,587 with the number of animals weaned at 37,477.
- ♣ Work is continuing on the design of the new catalogue service for both beef and dairy animals.
- ♣ Vets wishing to begin interacting with the AHI/ICBF system can register at http://www.animalhealthireland.ie/registerpage.php.
- ♣ The Dairy Replacements discussion group report has been completed and will be live next week.
- ♣ A development update to the Beef Slaughter report will begin next week.
- ♣ The design of a new infrastructure to manage genotypes at ICBF is continuing.
- ♣ The migration of the Teagasc advisor application to a new infrastructure should be completed next week. This will standardise how Teagasc, Vets, private consultants, etc access the ICBF database.
- Work on a new infrastructure for communicating with marts is on-going, with a view to getting the data flows on a more efficient and effective basis.

### 6. Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Intermediate beef genetic evaluation for animals linear scored since the 1st August 2010 has started.
- Results are expected to be available in the next 2 weeks.

### 7. Carcass Cuts

- ♣ The study for the estimation of genetic parameters for carcass cut weights is completed.
- New conversions of carcass images into cut weights are currently running to for the most recent mechanical grading images (up to May 2010).
- These conversions will be added to the existing one to be used for the study of correlations between carcass cut weights and currently recorded traits (linear, prices...).
