






## 1. Important Dates







- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2009 born calves with meal introduced is 641,529 with the number of animals weaned at 575,563.
- 4 A significant update to the suckler scheme screens is being designed and developed at the moment to help make the process more efficient.

- The new call logging system for herd-books continued this week, and will help provide improved transparency on the status of requests from herdbooks.

### 3. Grow

- For the second month in a row the total number of animals scored exceeds the corresponding month in 2009.
- ♣ The overall percentage of beef animals scored and weighed in the month of May was 96%.
- ♣ This compares to 84% of Pedigrees and 92% of Commercials in May 2009.
- ♣ A referencing session for the Scorers has been organised for the Dovea Farm next week.

### 4. Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Extracts are underway for the monthly beef evaluation update for linear scored animals.
- ♣ ICBF staff Pat Donnellan and Ross Evans had a stand on Tuesday at the Grange open day for farmer queries. Later that evening they attended the South Eastern Charolais club meeting in Abbeyleix where they discussed various aspects of the new sales catalogue and linear scoring with breeders.
