





# 1 Important Dates

- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 637,148 with the number of animals weaned at 579,046.
- **4** Suckler Scheme forms have been generated and distributed this week to all relevant herds.
- Testing continues on the prototype of a new cattle weighing scales with blue-tooth integration to ICBF handheld software.
- Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the up-coming national BVD eradication programme.
- The current batch of Dairy Co-op milk solids reports have now been distributed.
- Work on the screens to support the transfer of genotypes to and from the ICBF database is progressing well.

#### 3 Sheep Ireland

The Sheep Ireland Multibreed LambPlus sale is nearly upon us. Entries have been finalised at 126 rams, consisting of animals from seven different breeds. There are some fantastic evaluation figures accompanying some of these rams so we hope that ram buyers will acknowledge the potential benefit of this information and attend the sale on the day. This sale will be a hugely important event going forward, as it will not only provide









LambPlus breeders with an opportunity to show case there high genetic merit rams, but will also serve as a great educational tool to inform ram buyers of the benefits of purchasing recorded rams.

Last weekend was a busy one, with the Texel Premier show and sale attended on Friday and Saturday, and the Tullamore show attended on Sunday. Both events were extremely productive in terms of meeting with existing and potential LambPlus breeders and indeed in terms of speaking with commercial sheep farmers as to the merits of the €uro-Star system. The majority of commercial farmers which we spoke with over the course of the weekend showed a very good understanding of the €uro-Stars and the LambPlus system and this was hugely encouraging. It is nice to see that the message is getting out there.
