







2. Database





- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2009 born calves with meal introduced is 596,807 with the number of animals weaned at 503,366.
- 4 All the Suckler Herds have had their Animal Events Notebooks and envelopes posted out. A complimentary Herdplus Beef Calving Report was included for all suckler participants.
- All four milk recording organisations continue to work well on the new Milk Recording system. The final release of changes was implemented last weekend.
- ♣ The final changes to facilitate the migration to the new Beef Linear evaluations continue to be worked on. It is expected that the final catalogue updates will be completed at the end of next week.
- The generation of the spring EBI reports and data for discussion group reports etc has been completed this week.

3. GROW - Linear Scoring & Weight Recording

A meeting of the linear scorers was held on Thursday in Tully.

Some of the main issues which arose were:


- 1. What needs to be done to increase the level of scoring in pedigree herds?
- 2. There is huge scope for increasing scoring in breeds that now have BLUPs which didn't have them before.
- 3. The number of commercials being scored is increasing strongly from G€N€IR€LAND® beef herds.
- 4. More link up is needed between Breed Societies, Scorers and Tully.
- 5. A number of ways were identified for Linear Scorers to "Add Value" to the herd visit.




The tables show a slight dip in the level of weight recording compared to 2009.

5. Sheep Ireland

- LambPlus® presentation was given to the Galway Breed Society AGM last night (Thursday) in Athenry.
- LambPlus® breeders are entering Lambing data, also a few breeders have started to enter 40 Day weight results.
- ♣ The Growth report is further into development for LambPlus® breeders.
- ♣ New breeders will be getting access to the database for recording in the coming week.
- All MALP ewe DNA tissue has been sent to the lab for testing.
- ♣ Preparations are being made for lambing of the CPT flocks in early March.

6. Genetic Evaluations

- The active bull list for dairy is nearing completion and will be available next week. In addition a file of all available bulls will be made available.
- The beef linear scorers were briefed on changes to the evaluations at Tully on Thursday. An educational pack will be sent to each of the scorers and will be available for consultation with breeders on-farm. Niall Kilrane is taking over the running of the GROW[®] service and liaising with the scorers and will be dealing with linear scoring queries at farm level.
- The extra evaluation information on the bull search is almost complete and the bull search will be updated on Monday.
