2. Breeding Consultation Meetings


Presentation to the well-attended Breeding Consultation Meeting held on Tuesday can be found in the publications section of www.icbf.com. Key actions arising from the meeting (a copy of the minutes will be distributed to all invited to the meeting) included:


- → Development of a genomic evaluation and parentage testing service based on the 3K Illumina chip in conjunction with IHFA and Wetherby's is continuing with a view to the service being available for spring calving 2011.
- ♣ Distribution of results from test runs for the new fertility and calving evaluations which are under development. These will be considered for implementation at a further meeting scheduled for 8th December 2010.
- ♣ Development of a weight recording service which can operate independently of beef linear scoring have commenced.
- ♣ Further consultations on the GROW® review are to take place.
- ♣ Breeding Scheme design cost benefits and research studies are to be presented and considered at a meeting scheduled for 8th December.
- Further research is to be undertaken into indexes for suckler female replacement selection.

3. Audit & Finance Sub-Committee Meeting

At its meeting in Thursday the Sub-Committee agreed a budget for 2011 which it will recommend to the December meetings of ICBF and Sheep Ireland Boards.

- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 475,315 with the number of animals weaned at 291.351.







- ♣ The design of a new infrastructure to manage genotypes at ICBF is continuing. The development continues, and this development is expected to be completed before Christmas.
- 4 A new process for the reporting to breeders of sire errors on calf registrations is being designed. The aim is

to streamline the process and make it easier for farmers to complete the process on-line.

- 4 A webinar explaining the details of the new catalogue system was held with the beef herdbooks today.
- ♣ The generation of the Herdplus packs to support the spring calving season is continuing.

7. Tully

- ♣ Of the 170 bulls that passed the on-farm inspections, bloods have being received on 119 bulls to date. Blood samples will be accepted up until Monday, 22nd of November.
- ♣ All blood samples received have being sent to the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food lab, located in Backweston, Celbridge, Co Kildare. These samples are been analysed at present.
- Results for the majority of bulls will be available next week. Breeders will the then be notified whether or not their bull(s) have met the health testing criteria.

8. Genetic Evaluations

- Work is continuing on reliability calculations for the new dairy fertility proofs. Files of AI sire will be circulated to the industry partners once the reliabilities are finished.
- Work has commenced on estimating genetic parameters between carcass cut data estimated from digital imaging software with the existing traits in the beef performance evaluation.
- Francis Kearney gave a lecture to UCD veterinary and Agricultural science students on Friday 19th on ICBF beef and dairy breeding programs.
- Genetic evaluations will commence shortly for the last large evaluation of the year to be published in December.
