2 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Domestic milk productions (milk, fat, protein & SCC) were completed and are currently being prepared for international evaluations.
- New beef performance evaluations have been completed, with an additional 22,000 animals added to the evaluations (some 258,000 beef animals are now included in the beef production evaluation). These results will be presented at next Tuesdays beef industry meeting (24th January, 10.30 AM, Abbeyleix Manor Hotel).
- 4 A further beef linear type evaluation is currently being completed. This run includes information from multiple traits and additional "historical" data. Again, results from this evaluation will be presented at next weeks beef industry meetings.
- ♣ A meeting took place involving Irish Limousin Cattle Society (ILCS), UK Limousin Cattle Society and ICBF to discuss developments in international evaluations. Good progress is being made in the resolving of international ID problems, with agreement to proceed on a further international evaluation involving Irish, UK and French data.

3 Herd Health Visit to the Netherlands

Andrew Cromie and Sean Coughlan visited GD (originally Animal Health Services), along with Doreen Corridan (Dairygold), Simon More (CVERA) and Billy Kelleher (Teagasc). The purpose of the visit was to evaluate systems for Herd Health accreditation and support as operated by GD on behalf of Dutch farmers. The visit was very successful with an agreement to pursue the possibility of running a pilot "Herd Health Project" involving Dairygold suppliers (some 50 farmers), Teagasc, CVERA and ICBF.

4 International Cattle Breeders Round Table

Ross Evans and Francis Kearney attended the "International Cattle Breeders Round Table" held in Milan, Italy. The ICBF team also included John Hickey (currently pursuing a PhD program at ID Lelystad) and Marco Poole (ID Lelystad). Three papers were given by the Irish team; (i) Development of Health index for Irish dairy cattle, (ii) Calving Interval & Survival Evaluations in Irish Beef Cattle and (iii) Genetic parameters for carcass traits for Irish beef & dairy cattle. Each of the papers was very well received by the international breeders group, with positive comments about the rate of progress currently being achieved in Ireland. At the end of the meeting a request was put to the Irish team to host the next biennial meeting of this group. Naturally this request was accepted. We look forward to hosting this important event in January 2008.

5 Tully

- ♣ Plans for the Tully sales were presented at the Tully review meeting yesterday. A very productive meeting was held. The minutes of this meeting will be sent out to all who attended by the 30-1-06.
- ♣ Weights for the September intake were sent out to breeders on the 18-1-06. Each breeder also received a full explanation of the new EBI index system. The sale at Tully in March will be the first sale to include the new EBI indexes in the catalogue.
- 4 A group of 24 agricultural students from Tipperary will visit Tully on the 26-1-06 and not the 18-1-06 as originally planned.

6 Database Update

- ↓ 208 new herds added to the database last week. This week, the majority were Dovea AI customers.
- ♣ The first of the AI technicians from Dairygold were trained this week. Training will begin in Dovea next week.
- ♣ The upgrade of the production database to the next release of Oracle will be completed this weekend. ICBF staff will be working throughout the weekend on the task and it is expected that the database will be available from 1.30pm on Monday.
- A number of issues relating to the system speed this week will be addressed by the upgrade at the weekend and some process changes that will implemented in addition to the upgrade.
- ♣ Programming of the herdbook rule changes have continued this week. Some significant changes are required and it will be the end of January before these are fully completed.
- A new 'Stock Report' for farmers is in the final stages of testing. While it contains quite a lot of detail, this level of detail in this format is required. It will be especially useful to any farmers in completing REPS documentation or indeed Profit Monitor documentation. A sample copy of the report is attached below.
- ♣ The 2006 Animal Events Notebook distribution has been largely completed this week.






