




ICBF Weekly Update 20th July 2012

- **4** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 633,666 with the number of animals weaned at 569,558.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 575,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 416,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.61% BVD Virus Positive rate.
- Final tweaks to the Slaughter report were completed this week and are now being tested.
- The development around incorporation of the new genomic evaluations for type on the Genomic Evaluation Report is currently being tested.
- Work continues on the modification of systems to incorporate proposed changes to the Beef Euro Star indexes.

- ♣ Work is continuing on the back-end ICBF web infrastructure with a view to making it more standardised and robust.

6 Sheep Ireland

- Last Friday, July 13th, Sheep Ireland was involved in a day of In-service training for Teagasc sheep advisors.
- ♣ We visited the MALP farm of Godfrey Potterton and the CPT farm of Andrew Moloney. Throughout the day there was some good discussion about the current breed improvement programme. Noirin McHugh gave a great







presentation on genetics and the progress being made so far by the €uro Star evaluations. There is currently a 4kg difference in weaning weight being recorded between 1 and 5 star rams and this is a message we need to get out to sheep farmers for the current ram buying season. Teagasc sheep advisors will be critical to educating the wider industry about the benefits of buying rams with evaluations. We would like to thank both Godfrey and Andrew for giving their time and for contributing very strongly to the discussions.

 \blacksquare The Suffolk premier sale took place on Saturday July 14th. After discussions with the society throughout the

year, €uro Star evaluations were displayed within the main sale catalogue. Unfortunately, these evaluations could only be added to the rear of the catalogue due to problems with printing, but it was a promising move none the less. It was evident that people were paying attention to the information, certainly more so than at the same sale in 2011. Awareness is growing; the rate of this growth however needs to be increased. Helping Teagasc sheep advisors gain a deeper understanding of the programme will help considerably.
