






1. Important Dates

2. Database





- ≠ 39,417 inseminations have been received so far in 2009, compared with 37,644 in 2008 for the same period.
- → The 2009 Suckler Scheme calvings are continuing at a solid rate. In relation to 2008 born calves, the number of calves with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 757,000, with just over 662,000 of these having been weaned.
- ♣ The revamp of the Milk Recording system continues. Testing has continued this week, and it is envisaged that there are about another 4 weeks of testing left. Parallel runs on some Munster Milk Recording herds will begin next week.
- Work will begin next week on updates to the Fertility reports for the coming AI season.
- ♣ Work on a new mechanism of sending and receiving Suckler scheme data to DAFF is beginning and will take a number of weeks to complete.
- Development on the sheep application continues, with on-going updates being released.

3. Tully

- Bulls are finishing there performance test today (Friday 20th) with 86 days of individual feed intake and five live-weights obtained. Final results of the performance test will be posted out to bull owners and breed societies and contains information which includes feed efficiency, average daily gain and scanned muscle and fat depth.
- All bulls were washed this week and blood samples were obtained for the DNA bank.
- There has been a good response across breeds for the next intake in May with application forms been received at a steady rate.

4. Lambplus®

Changes were made to the Rearing Screen this week so as all of the lambs were ordered based on their tag numbers.

- 4 A modification to the lambing screen that will ensure that when multiple lambs are being entered that the Ram ID entered for the first lamb is replicated for the other lambs.
- The first of the completed Lambing & Mating Recording sheets for Flockowners signed up to the 'Paper' service were received this week.
- Following the phone calls that were made to Lambplus Users that hadn't logged in as of last week there was a lot more activity on the Lambplus database in the last few days.
- → All of the Inventory sheets for the MALP flocks have now been completed and sent back to us. This was a huge piece of work and will allow us compile an accurate inventory of sheep for each flock with their NSIS numbers, sex & age details recorded. This is the first time that such information has been recorded on such a widespread scale in commercial sheep flocks in Ireland.
- The first of the orders for electronic tags for these flocks have also been made. These tags are expected to arrive in the next week.
- ♣ One MALP flock to-date has had its lambs weighed using the Pratley sheep unit. The functionality of the Pratley proved a great success in carrying out this job.


5. GROW - Linear Scoring & Weight Recording



- The quality of data being recorded by the ICBF team of Scorers continues to maintain its high levels for the month of February as shown by the graph.

 Pedigree Cattle Weight Recording Trends
- ♣ The Scorers will be shortly involved in inspecting the latest crop of Bulls for Tully.
- The GROW[®] programme continues to capture valuable score & weight data in commercial beef herds.
- The latest example of this was in the herd of Ken Power from Mountbellew, Co.Galway. Ken is a participant in the Beef Gene Ireland programme and on the 9th March he had 45 Beef Weanlings

Linear Scored & Weight Recorded. John Beirne was the scorer that carried out the work.



- ♣ The Weanlings were:
 - o Sired by 5 different Beef AI Sires from 3 different breeds (LM, BB, CH).
 - o All 150-300 days old.
- This is the type of data of quality data that when recorded accurately on-farm will have a big impact on the subsequent €uro-Star evaluations.

6. Genetic Evaluations

Dairy & Beef

- The production and calving interval evaluations have been completed and are being processed for submission to Interbull early next week.
- All other evaluations will commence next week.
- ♣ Presentations were given at two Limousin club meetings during the week.




8. G€NE IRELAND®
