
2. Flooding


Severe flooding in Bandon last night caused serious disruption to our network. While the main database computer and backup are located in separate buildings well away from flooding risk we are still reliant on the phone network and in particular the Bandon exchange. Eircom have advised they expect to have the current problems resolved over the weekend.

As part of our renovations at Highfield house we have secured access to the BT Fibre Cable that goes from Cork to Clonakilty and bypasses the Bandon exchange. This access is in the process of being commissioned and in the near future will provide added security in the event of a further failure at the Bandon exchange.


With the hardware changes we will be making next weekend, we will also have a 'microwave line' available as a back-up for future broadband outages.

3. Database





- → All suckler scheme herds with a calving in 2009 have now received their first pre-weaning form. The number of 2009 born calves with meal introduced is 491,000, with the number of animals weaned at 275,000.
- ♣ All systems will be unavailable over next weekend from 3pm Friday (27th November) till 9:00am on Monday (30th Nov) to facilitate a major infrastructure upgrade.

- ♣ All four milk recording organisations are working well on the new Milk Recording system. We are continuing to update the software based on feedback from the organisations.
- The graph (previous page) shows Inseminations recoded on AI Handhelds in 2009 compared with 2008. There are more technicians using the handhelds in 2009 than there were in 2008, so even though the number of inseminations recorded is up, overall inseminations for the season will be down.

4. Genetic Evaluations

Beef

- ♣ During the week Ross Evans gave a lecture to Agriculture and Veterinary student in UCD on the various aspects involved in beef cattle breeding.
- Work on the test runs for the new calving interval and survival proofs and the calving performance proofs continued this week.

Sheep

- The genetic evaluation for sheep has been run globally, i.e., all breeds in the same run. Thierry is working on this in NZ with Peter Amer and Tim Byrne. He incorporated the pedigree and the MALP data and fitted heterosis and recombination coefficients. The results looked promising so far with more work to be completed next week..
- Next week, Thierry plans to run an across breed genetic evaluation using Mix99 for sheep.

ICBF will be holding its annual farmer user meeting on Thursday 10th December in Corrin Mart. This is an annual event in the dairy calendar where ICBF shares the latest on breeding developments with its users and the wider industry.
