

2 Progress

I had the pleasure of addressing a combined Arrabawn and IFA meeting in Nenagh last night (a copy of my slides is in the publications section of <u>www.icbf.com</u>). My address covered the practical question of finding the best cattle to breed from and the tools that are available to help a farmer in this quest. The live Active Bull Lists (dairy or beef) is a very good starting point for a farmer who is considering the use of AI. The online Herd Book is a good place to go for stock bulls. HerdPlus[®] is the service that deals with the selection of females and males within the herd. These tools are now being heavily used by farmers. Last year (2010) there were some 500,000 bull searches undertaken on the ICBF website.

Also this week we have been progressing the breeding scheme proposal in consultation with stakeholders. The ICBF Board will be briefed on progress at its meeting next week. The availability of genomic tools has created a marvellous opportunity for the breeding sector to make a major long term contribution to the profitability of Irish dairy farming. However, to ensure the maximum benefits are delivered to farmers we will need to make some changes and make some investments. I look forward to working with all stakeholders, in the weeks ahead, to ensure the need for change is fully understood and that our industry moves in the direction that delivers the greatest possible benefits to Irish farmers.

- **4** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 557,401 with the number of animals weaned at 459,208.
- 4 The generation of a '5 Year Trend' report for suckler herds is continuing.
- The design of a new infrastructure to manage genotypes at ICBF has been largely completed and testing/tweaking of the solution is continuing.

- The testing of the solution to allow farmers' avail of the genotyping service has been finalised. It will be launched next week at the HerdPlus[®]/ G€N€IR€LAND[®] User conference on January 26th.
- A testing of the new process for the reporting to breeders of sire errors on calf registrations should be completed next week.
- A new authorisation module for farmers and their service providers is ready for testing. This will give farmers more flexibility and control in providing authorisation to others to see their data.
- The generation of the HerdPlus[®] packs to support the spring calving season is continuing.


