





2 HerdPlus®

- This week we released the EBI reports for our 6,000 dairy herds. For the first time the national average EBI for animals has hit the €100 mark. It's just a few short years since we had the EBI100 competition, which saw only the very best farmers in the country achieving this target. Today this is the average for the national herd.
- The graph showing the 15 year trend in EBI based on year of birth shows some big improvement in the last 3-4 years. The median EBI of 2012 born females is €126. While the Fertility sub-index has seen some strong gains in the last few years, the Milk sub-index has also continued to improve at a steady rate. The main reason for the big improvement in the last couple of years is as a result of the big uptake in the use of genomic sires which accounted for 47% of the AI usage in 2011.



3 Genetic Evaluations

- The extra information tabs for the traits in the genetic evaluation has now been uploaded to the database and is available on the bull search.
- ♣ This week staff met with different breed societies and AI companies to update them on the new beef indexes.
- ♣ Extracts for a new beef linear evaluation have been done. Results will be available around 1st October.







4 Sheep Ireland


- ◆ Over the past week Sheep Ireland have presented at a number of sheep meetings. On Friday last we were on the farm of John Brooks, a well-known pedigree and commercial sheep farmer based in Ballinasloe. The meeting was centered around preparation for mating preparation of the ram and the ewes. There was a very interested and receptive group present on the day and it was refreshing to see that many were already making use of the €iroStar evaluations.
- On Monday evening we met with the Offaly Lamb Producer group who are doing fantastic work to help promote the Sheep Ireland breed improvement programme. This year the group offered a financial incentive to their members to purchase high genetic merit rams. Qualification for this incentive was not only dependent on the purchase of a Five Star ram but also on the condition that the flock owner attends a




Sheep farmers at the Teagasc farm walk on the farm of John Brooks.

- Sheep Ireland information meeting. It is hugely encouraging that groups such as this are now taking this kind of initiative. Education is absolutely critical to the success of the GroStars. While it is great to hear that commercial farmers are buying more Five Star rams, they need to know why they are buying them.
- We are always more than happy to attend any meetings to help people (pedigree breeders & commercial farmers) understand why the €uroStars are so important to the future progress of sheep in this country. Sheep Ireland will be present at the National Ploughing championships in New Ross next week. We will be located in the Sheep tunnel so anyone with any queries is welcome to call by.

5 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 248,546, with the number of animals weaned at 48,589.
- → BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 583,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 433,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.62% BVD Virus Positive rate.








The new Dairy and Beef bull search on the website continues to get a lot of use following the release of the latest proofs. We are currently working on a mobile friendly

- While some of the components have been released, work continues on the modification for other outputs to incorporate proposed changes to the Beef EuroStar indexes.
- ♣ Work is continuing on the back-end ICBF web infrastructure with a view to making it more standardised and robust.


