At its meeting on Thursday the Board:


- ♣ Considered and adopted Strategic Priorities for 2011. These will be used in formulating the budget for 2011, which will be considered firstly, by the Audit & Finance Sub-Committee (in November) and then the Board at its December meeting.
- ♣ Viewed a demonstration of the catalogue service launched in the last few weeks in association with ICBF's Herd Book members.
- Was informed of consultation plans arising from the decision to review the GROW® service. Consultation with stakeholders will commence shortly with the following objectives:
  - a. To establish a weight recording service.
  - b. To review the traits included in the beef linear scoring service, the ages at which animals are scored and means by which the service is provided. The overall objective is to ensure the service provides information that is valued by bull breeders and bull (and semen) buyers.
  - c. To review and identify strategies for ensuring data recorded in bull breeding and commercial herds can be reliably used in genetic evaluations, which are valued by bull buyers.


#### 4. Sheep Ireland Board

- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 405,086 with the number of animals weaned at 158,749.
- The new dairy catalogue functionality was launched very successfully by IHFA at the Millstreet Dairy Show last weekend. There has been a very encouraging uptake by IHFA members this week. Next week, the focus will switch to assisting the beef herdbooks get the message out in relation to the beef catalogue functionality.

#### 6. GROW®

- 4 Yet again the total number of animals weighed and scored in September exceeds the corresponding month in 2009.
- ♣ 882 Pedigree and 923 Commercial animals were weighed and scored in September.
- ♣ The overall percentage of beef animals scored and weighed in September was 97%.
- ♣ 95% of Pedigrees and 100% of Commercials were weighed and scored.
- ♣ Work is continuing on the review of the GROW® service

#### 8. Genetic Evaluations

#### **Beef**

The extracts for the October beef genetic evaluation have taken place and this evaluation has commenced. The new proofs (for linear scored animals scored between 15<sup>th</sup> September and 16<sup>th</sup> October) will be loaded to the database ahead of GROW reports being sent out on the 1<sup>st</sup> November.

#### 9. Sheep Ireland

#### **Sheep Genetic Evaluation**

4 Across breed genetic evaluation is currently being tested. This is facilitated by the improved genetic linkage between breeds provided by Malp & CPT flocks. Two software systems are currently being tested in addition to the present one (ASreml): that is, MixBlup and DMU. The outputs are analysed on breeding values estimation, reliability computation, and running time.

#### 10. Tully

4 A total of 265 bulls across 12 different breeds have being entered by breeders for the November Tully intake (Table 1). Bulls are being inspected on farms by Linear scorers. They are assessing the bulls for muscle, skeletal and functionality traits and it is hoped to have inspections completed by Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> of November. Once on farm inspection have being completed, breeders whose bulls have passed will receive the health testing requirements by mail.
