




## 2 Database Update





- 337,058 inseminations have been received so far in 2007, compared with 145,898 in 2006 for the same period.
- ♣ The majority of herdbooks are continuing to use the new Web Front end as the main means of completing Herdbook administration activities. Focus is now switching towards ensure that the catalogue process is in order for the coming sales season.
- Further work on HerdPlus modules is on-going, focusing around the data recording aspects, and the new 'look and feel' to the farmer interface.
- Development on a number of reports for Suckler Beef Herds is ongoing in advance of the Ploughing championships.
- ₩ Work is continuing on the Sire Advice module for the new season.
- ♣ Progress continues on the redesign of the Animal Events file processing which will be completed over the coming months.
- Work on Gene Ireland reports and user interfaces is also on-going, in advance of the Autumn Gene Ireland programme kicking off for both dairy and beef.

#### 3 G€N€IR€LAND

- → Deadline for recording Spring inseminations onto the Cattle Breeding Database is 31st August, with an aim of having payments for Recorded Inseminations completed by the Ploughing.
- As of last Monday, 56% of straws dispatched to G€N€IR€LAND herds had an associated insemination on the Database.

- Criteria for selecting the next intake have been received from the Charolais, Limousin and Simmental breed societies.


## 6 Interbull and EAAP Meetings

## **Linear Scoring & Weighing Survey –**


- The Herdplus Office recently conducted a Survey on Linear Scoring & Weight Recording to a random sample of Breeders from all of the various Breed Societies.







