2 Beef Breeding - €uro-Star Enhancements

The enhancements resulting from the €uro-Star review went live this week. This is the first step of a major effort which will take several months to complete. This week the focus has been on changing the bull search and the HerdPlus €uro-Star reports.

Over the coming weeks and month we have a major campaign planned to both implement the enhancements in all ICBF supported systems and to ensure advisors and farmers quickly come to understand how to make best use of the improved information.

Our extension and education campaign is focused on educating the educators and includes a relatively small number of public events where breeders can hear directly from the key technical people responsible for the enhanced beef evaluations. The main elements are:

- **Training of 115 Teagasc B&T Advisors**. This will take place next week at five locations (Ennis, Macroom, Dundalk, Longford and Kildalton). Teagasc advisory services, as the deliverers of information and knowledge to farmers, are a key part of our overall strategy.
- **Briefing of Herd Book Councils**. At their forthcoming meetings the Councils of all beef Herd Books will be briefed on the enhancements by one of ICBF's beef specialists.
- Weekly Journal Page. ICBF's page in the Irish Farmers Journal will be used over the next few weeks to explain the enhancements, the reasons they are being made and the implications for beef breeding decisions.
- **Pedigree Bull Sales**. ICBF will provide, on request, a beef specialist to attend pedigree bull sales and provide a summary of the enhancements as well as answering questions and investigating concerns.
- Irish Grassland Assn Beef Conference and Farm Walk (4th September). Beef breeding (including new indexes, weight recording and ICBF HerdPlus) will play a prominent role at the afternoon farm walk.
- **Ploughing.** (25th to 27th September in Wexford). ICBF will have two beef specialists in attendance each day to answer any technical queries relating to the new indexes.
- **Teagasc / ICBF Suckler Cow Conference** (11th October at Tullamore Court Hotel) will include papers giving the background to the enhancements and provide a forum for sharing knowledge.
- ICBF / TEAGASC Cattle Genetics & Genomics Conference (6th November, Killeshin Hotel, Portlaoise). This will be a technical / scientific meeting aimed at ensuring the science community is focus on the priority issues for beef and dairy cattle breeding.









- ICBF / FBD Beef Cattle Breeding Event at Tully on Saturday 10th November. This event will feature live cattle including 80 animals completing the first progeny test at the revamped Tully. It will be the culmination of our extension and education efforts in 2012 addressing the full range of enhancements in Ireland's beef cattle breeding systems and services.
- **ICBF HerdPlus** office (1850 600 900) will be taking calls from clients to discuss the enhancement and provide support to herd owners.
- **HerdPlus Farmers** will be getting a direct mailing in next month with their own animals evaluation with explanatory material.
- HerdPlus Farmers can query their own New Index Profiles as of today.

- **u** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 112,474, with the number of animals weaned at 13,786.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 580,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 426,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.62% BVD Virus Positive rate.
- The new Dairy and Beef bull search on the website has been released this week.
- While some of the components have been released, work continues on the modification for other outputs to incorporate enhancements to the Beef €uro-Star indexes.
- Work is continuing on the back-end ICBF web infrastructure with a view to making it more standardised and robust.
- The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2012 compared with 2011.



4 Genetic Evaluations

- New genetic evaluations are now available for dairy and beef animals. Extra information on the bull search for each of the traits will be updated as it becomes available.
- Work is underway for the next Interbull test-run in early September. This includes validation of genomic proofs in advance of the introduction of an International Genomic Evaluation for foreign bulls.
