2 ICAR 2012


We are currently focused on organising the ICAR conference which will take place next week at the




- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 615,475 with the number of animals weaned at 544,714.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 564,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 374,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.60% BVD Virus Positive rate.
- The current trial weight recording cell operating out of Tully continues to work well in conjunction with the newly designed 'split platform'.
- The on-going developments to further enhance the loading of genotype information to the database are continuing. Some final tweaks have been made to the genotype sharing application. This will again be available for demonstration at the ICAR conference next week.







- Significant progress has been made in relation to the system design of the OPTIMIR spectral data project, and good progress is being made with the milk testing laboratories in relation to the extracts of the spectral data on an on-going basis.
- The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2012compared with 2011.



4 Sheep Ireland

♣ On Tuesday last (22nd May) the Irish Grassland Association annual conference and farm walk was hosted by LambPlus breeders Gordon & Yvonne Johnston. The day was a great success with a very large attendance and hugely interesting and relevant papers presented. The Johnston farm is an excellent example of what can be achieved by maintaining detailed flock records on every animal from birth. All lambs are tagged at birth with no fuss and strict culling decisions are made annually based on records gathered from this point forward throughout the year. The end product of this work has resulted in the development of a highly productive flock of mainly Lleyn X Texel sheep scanning 2 lambs per ewe annually.



- Next week will be a very busy one for Sheep Ireland. ICAR 2012 boasts the strongest ever program of sheep orientated papers being presented. Tuesday, Thursday and Friday are the days most relevant to sheep enthusiasts, with Thursday's events involving a technical tour to the farms of John Large & John Renehan two farmers heavily involved in the Sheep Ireland program since its development. The objective of these tours will be to illustrate to attending delegates how Irish sheep farmers are increasing profitability and sustainability on their farms. - Data continues to flow in from our LambPlus, MALP & CPT flocks. Evaluations are running on a weekly basis now. We encourage breeders who have not yet submitted information, to do so as soon as possible. The sale season is fast approaching and our intention to include €uro-Star information in all early sale catalogues will be dependent on breeder's cooperation in terms of submitting information. First society sale this year will be the Suffolk premier sale in Roscrea on the 14th July, followed closely by the Vendeen sale on the 18th. It will be hugely important that we have all information submitted a month in advance of these sale dates to facilitate each society adequate time to prepare and print catalogues. Ultrasound scanning has commenced and all breeders will be contacted in the coming days to book appropriate times to get this valuable information collected.
