



2 Interbull, Interbeef & EAAP

- Ireland and ICBF are represented at the Interbull and EAAP meetings which start today, in Stavanger, Norway, run through the weekend and finish Thursday next week. Some 1,200 animal scientists from around the world will be in attendance.
- The weekend will be taken up with Interbull meetings. Andrew Cromie has been appointed to the Interbull Steering Committee by the UK, Dutch and Irish members. He will be serving an initial term of three years commencing at these meetings. The Interbull Open Meeting agenda contains 53 papers on a range of subjects relevant to dairy cattle genetic evaluations and dairy breeding in general. A copy of Andrew's presentation will go into the publications section of www.icbf.com early next week.
- The EAAP meeting starts on Monday next week and includes a joint session with Interbull on genomics. I have been asked to give the first paper in this session and will cover the relevance of the Interbull structures, set-up to provide international sire evaluations, in the era of genomics. A copy of my presentation will also go up on www.icbf.com early next week.
- → During the meetings the ten organisations that have agreed to sign-up for the next phase in the development of Interbeef will be signing the Interbeef Agreement. This will clear the way for the sharing of data and the establishment of an international genetic evaluation service for beef breeds and traits. The service will be developed by the Interbull Centre based at the Swedish University of Agricultural Science.
- ♣ Several papers will be given to the EAAP meeting by members of the ICBF and Teagasc teams. More details next week.



- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- ♣ In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 641,858 with the number of animals weaned at 586,103.
- ♣ The health recording forms for the Dairy Efficiency Scheme (DEP) will be sent to farmers in the first weeks of September.
- ♣ Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the up-coming national BVD eradication programme.
- The genotype database management solution that ICBF have in place will be demonstrated to those with whom we have genotype sharing arrangements at a meeting in Norway today.
