2 IRIS User Group Meeting


- ICBF is hosting a meeting of the IRIS User Group next week. This meeting with be attended by representatives of the countries and organisations who use the IRIS database to support the information needs of their breeding industries.
- The topics being discussed include experiences with IRIS and priorities for future development.
- Field trips have been organized to show how ICBF, and its service providing members, use IRIS to support data recording and cattle breeding information services to Irish farmers.

3 Genetic Evaluations – Beef & Dairy

- Draft Proofs for bulls with AI codes were distributed to the industry for comment. Official Proofs will be released next week.
- Work continues for the G€N€ IR€LAND [®] Dairy Test bulls from Spring 2005 re: Insemination records, On-Farm record keeping etc.
- Work continues on the issues highlighted at the last Beef industry meeting including the maternal subindex, genetic parameters and linear type evaluations.
- Further improvements have been made to the Hereford International Pedigree File & the Limousin file for the prototype genetic evaluation.

4 Database Update


- 72 new herds added to the database last week
- Over 75,000 inseminations have now been recorded on the AI handhelds. This is an average of 1000 per handheld.
- Further report development to support the AI handheld application is on-going.
- The standby database is now operational.







- 507 week 3 fertility reports have been issued so far. 129 week 6 reports have also issued. Feedback is very positive.
- The new load of dairy genetic evaluations is nearing completion and will be available next week.
- Development of a front end for sending text messages from ICBF is ongoing.



- A web page that allows farmers enter pregnancy data directly is now available on the Online Reports part of the website.
- Development has started on an internal system for entering G€N€ Ireland data into the database.




6 Tully
