2 ICBF Board Meeting

Decisions made at yesterdays Board meeting included:

- Adoption of a draft Strategic Plan as the basis for formulating the 2008 budget which will be considered at the next Board meeting. The draft Plan for 2008 includes a number of service quality initiatives, contains a consolidated approach to breeding schemes through G€N€IR€LAND and includes initiatives to explore new service opportunities.
- Approval of ICBF providing administrative and technical support services to the Sheep Industry on the clear understanding that: a. this will be done in a way that does not compromise the ability of ICBF to achieve its cattle breeding mission, b. these activities are cost neutral to ICBF, and c. the involvement of ICBF is fully supported by the Sheep Industry.

3 Tully

- A list of bulls that are currently being inspected for Tully was sent to breed societies on the 25-10-07.
- Inspections of bulls for the December intake to Tully will be finished before 29-10-07.
- Health testing letters will be sent out to breeders from 30-10-07 and all health testing will be carried out before the 7-11-07.

4 HerdPlus

- An update of the Beef Euro-Star report based on farmer feedback, is now complete and will be posted to 4,350 herds next week.

SPRING 2007


- All payments for recorded inseminations from the Spring 2007 programme have now been made. A summary of key statistics include:
 - Total of 687 herds
 - 28,633 straws dispatched
 - 22,956 recorded inseminations





- 80% response rate
- Total payment of €114,730
- 190 herds paid by Cheque
- 444 herds paid by Direct Credit

The following graph shows the percentage of recorded inseminations in relation to the number of straws dispatched. As can be seen, at total of 445 herds (64.7%) used 80-100% of their allocated straws.




AUTUMN 2007

- Herd recruitment and semen dispatch for the Autumn 2007 programme continues. There are currently some 95 herds signed up.
- Due to unavailability of semen for Ballycairn Linus (ABS test bull), we have replaced him with a test bull from Dovea – Conbrick Vanessa Oman 2 (VNO). The revised panel of test bulls is as follows:



6 Database Update





- 355,023 inseminations have been received so far in 2007 from AI Handhelds, compared with 156,550 in 2006 for the same period.
- 4 Another batch of €uro-Star reports have been finalised and will be issued next week.
- **u** The Final Fertility reports continue to flow, as insemination data/pregnancy is entered to the database.
- Progress continues on the redesign of the Animal Events file processing which will be completed over the coming months.
- Preparations are continuing in order to be ready for the commencement of the Suckler Cow Welfare Scheme, which will have a significant impact in terms of data volumes coming into the database, with Animal Events being the means of data recording.
- ↓ Work is continuing on the Sire Advice module for the new season.
- The implementation of the new hardware solution and database upgrade is on-going. We overcame a significant stumbling block this week in relation to the IRIS software working on the new platform, so progress on this project will accelerate again. We will be working with the user organisations in testing the upgraded application.
- Last weekend saw the Limousin society using a beef catalogue for commercial animals at a 'commercial breeding female' sale. This was the first time a catalogue for commercial beef animals was generated from the ICBF database. feedback has been positive.
