2 Breeding Information Services


At a meeting involving ICBF and service providers on Tuesday it was agreed to proceed with further discussions, involving those present plus extra technical input from ICBF, to:


- i. explore the establishment of a management committee comprising representatives of service providers and ICBF, and

3 Database Update

- **♣** 135 new herds added to the database last week.
- Approximately 23,000 inseminations have now been captured across around 75 AI handhelds. A number of teething problems concerning data are being dealt with.
- Backend work in the area of pricing and billing files for the AI service is continuing.
- A performance audit of the SQL-Server database was carried out in conjunction with a consultant from Version-1.
- In-breeding charts for a number of G€N€ Ireland herds have been completed.
- The sire advice reports
