





1. Important Dates

2. Database



- The 2009 suckler forms (pre and post weaning) continue to go out to farmers. The total number of calves (2008 & 2009) with a meal feeding introduction has increased to 989,000, with just over 748,000 of these having been weaned.
- The revamp of the Milk Recording system is progressing. Testing within the milk recording organisations continues this week.
- Work has begun on the new Beef Discussion Group Reports, with some now in the testing phase.
- Development of a new on-line application for AI companies to manage their interaction with ICBF on bull codes has begun. We expect this to be live at the end of September.



The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2009 compared with 2008. There are

more technicians using the handhelds in 2009 than there were in 2008, so even though the number of inseminations recorded is up, overall inseminations for the season will be down.

5. Genetic Dairy & Beef Evaluations

Beef

- The proofs from the latest beef evaluation have been loaded to the database and parental averaging and calculation of percentiles for stars has begun. Proofs should be on the website next week.
- Development work on an across breed evaluation for linear type traits in beef is almost complete and will be presented at the beef industry meeting next Tuesday. It is hoped to send out a file of test proofs on Monday ahead of the meeting.
- A new joint docility evaluation (animal welfare and linear score) has also been completed and will also be discussed at the meeting before a decision is made to publish

Dairy

- A provisional list of Dairy EBI proofs have been sent to the Industry. We are currently doing the parent average and will have the final proofs by Tuesday of next week. Please note the following:
 - 1) The publication rules for GS bulls are that we use domestic information greater than 70% reliability for production, calving and beef, and >50% for fertility and health. The effect of this is that test bulls just getting their first milk proofs will have their production proof based on a daughter proof but the fertility will be still a GS proof
 - 2) For domestically proven bulls (i.e. tested in Ireland or foreign bulls with >90% rel in Ireland) we have used the fertility evaluations from the last run due to larger than expected changes for some bulls. We are investigating this change further. We have however received updated information for foreign bulls for fertility from Interbull
 - 3) Early results from the group of test bulls used in 2006 who got a GS proof in Jan but now have a daughter proof are very much in line with expectations and the GS proofs are providing us with a better handle on the bulls proof compared to parent average. These results were presented at the Interbull meeting last weekend
