## 5 Dairy Breeding Conference sponsored by FIBID Trust

On Wednesday this week some 250 farmers attended a very successful ICBF dairy cattle breeding conference at Cork Mart's Corrin facility near Fermoy. This was the 4<sup>th</sup> annual breeding conference for **HerdPlus**<sup>®</sup> & **GeNe IReLAND**<sup>®</sup> users.

The morning session which was sponsored by FBD Trust comprised five presentations covering developments in Dairy Genetic Evaluations, Genomics, HerdPlus<sup>®</sup> & G $\in$ N $\in$ IR $\in$ LAND<sup>®</sup>. At the conference the HerdPlus<sup>®</sup> team launched their new **Genomic Service** which opens up genotyping to dairy farmers for both male and female animals. This service is an application of the successful research done by Teagasc and introduces the low cost 3K chip which brings the cost of genotyping down to  $\in$ 0 (inc. VAT) per animal. The service will be available from February 2011. ### ACC Bank / TEAGASC EBI Discussion Group Winners 2010

The €5,000 first prize in the EBI Discussion Group Competition was won by the **Deise 1250 Dairy Discussion Group** based in Waterford. The prize was presented to the winning group in Fermoy, Co. Cork, on Wednesday, 26th January 2011. A very high standard of performance was achieved by farmers this year, with the winning group achieving 402 marks out of 500 in the competition.

Over one thousand dairy farmers, members of eighty dairy discussion groups from around the country participated in this hotly contested competition, judged against set performance criteria focusing on; Breeding, Year-on-year Improvements made in the Group, and ultimately Business/Profit indices. (Judges were George Ramsbottom Teagasc, Andrew Cromie & Kevin Downing ICBF, and Jack Kennedy from the Irish Farmers Journal).

In addition to the top prize there were three regional winners which each received €2,000 prize money (namely **The South Offaly Group, The Acorn Group and the DairyMis Group**). A further seventeen 17 groups nationally were also commended, each receiving €500.

In addition to the "Established" Group competition, this year we also saw the inaugural competition for **NEW** Discussion Groups for which there were some one hundred Groups entered. This, as the name suggests, is to encourage the set up and development of new Discussion Groups throughout the country. These will be judged on a county basis and winners will be announced over the next weeks.

The EBI competition promotes better breeding on dairy farms. Its S0,000 prize fund was sponsored by ACCBank and the competition is run in association with Teagasc, ICBF and the Irish Farmers Journal. Speaking at the EBI awards Sean Farrell, National Agri Manager at ACCBank said "ACCBank is delighted to continue our sponsorship of the EBI Competition. The improvements in EBI being achieved in some herds throughout the country is an example to all milk producers of what can be achieved within local discussion groups."

### **Continuous Improvement**

Commenting on the event, ICBF chief executive, Brian Wickham complimented the improvements made by group members in the last 12 months. "*The fact that this year the judges added criteria to measure year on year improvement means those Groups who constantly strive for improvement were rewarded and scored well*".

Members have an average herd EBI for the group of €94. For 2010 the group averaged 940 kilograms of milk solids per hectare.








- **4** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 563,401 with the number of animals weaned at 471,208.
- The distribution of the '5 Year Trend' report for suckler herds is continuing. A sample report can be seen at the end of the update.
- **4** The first of the 3k Chip genotypes are being run through the new Genotype Storage infrastructure this week.
- 4 A new 'Expected Calving' profile was put live this week for Herdplus users.
- **4** A new infrastructure for capturing and loading mart weights and slaughter weights is nearing completion.
- The final tweaks to the new process for the reporting to breeders of sire errors on calf registrations are being worked on this week.
- Testing on a new authorisation module for farmers and their service providers will begin next week. This will give farmers more flexibility and control in providing authorisation to others to see their data.
- Work continues with AHI on the integration of laboratory health test results to the ICBF database.

# Some Explanatory Notes for the 5 Year Trend Report

In preparing the report, the figures for the 'Top 15%' are calculated individually for each measure, and for each year - i.e. herds in the 'Top 15%' for one measure may not be in the 'Top 15%' for another measure.

The following outlines how each of the measures is calculated:

### **Calving Interval**

The average Number of days between successive calving's for cows during the report period.

### Calves per Cow per Year

The number of live calves born in the period, expressed as a proportion of all beef cows in the herd.

### Average Age of First Calf

The Average age at which heifers calved in the report period.

### Average Number of Calving's Per Cow

The average number of calvings for cows that had a calf in the report period.


### Cows Not Calving In the Period (%)


The percentage of cows that have previously had a calf that did not calve in the report period.

### Number of Months with a Calving

This is the number of months in the year in which the herd had a calf born.
