







#### 2 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 415,665 with the number of animals weaned at 161,347.
- 4 Around 3,600 herds have already completed their Dairy Efficiency Programme (DEP) health recording requirements for 2011. There are around 6,500 herds in the DEP.
- Testing continues on the prototype of a new cattle weighing scales with blue-tooth integration to ICBF handheld software. A few teething problems arose this week out on farm, and we are dealing with the issues as they arise.
- ♣ The development in relation to the farmer upload and download of data to existing scales out on farms (e.g. Tru-test scales) will be live next week.
- Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the up-coming national BVD eradication programme.
- The loading of the high density beef genotype files to the ICBF database is on-going.
- The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2011compared with 2010.

#### **Dairy**

- ♣ There are 61 herds signed up to the programme so far taking a total of 2,060 straws.
- ♣ An additional bull GGZ has been added to the list. A revised catalogue is available on the ICBF website.
- ♣ Further letters were sent this week targeting additional Autumn herds.

### 4 Sheep Ireland

- This week Sheep Ireland representatives in association with Teagasc held a meeting in Westport Co. Mayo. The meeting was very positive and highlighted the positive mood that exists within the industry at present. There were two main agendas on the night, to inform non-recording pedigree breeders about the merits of LambPlus and the €uro-Star evaluations, and to advance the establishment of a pedigree Mayo/Connemara Mountain Blackface Sheep Society.
- There was a good attendance on the night and the main issue raised was the current threat posed to the Mayo/Connemara Mountain Blackface breed by inbreeding and cross breeding with various other strains of the Blackface breed. It was agreed that in order to protect and promote the breed going forward, that a pedigree society was essential. Breeders are now in the early stages of assembling a committee to establish a formal structure to the society. Sheep Ireland will provide the database and facility for each pedigree breeder to record birth details etc. We will also provide the society with the capability to produce pedigree certificates and sale catalogues.
- Also in attendance on the night were some non-recording pedigree breeders, we were delighted that these breeders committed to record for the coming season. We would especially like to welcome the Blue Faced Leicester breeders that signed up on the night. These will be the first pedigree Blue Faced Leicester animals to be recorded on LambPlus and we will hope to engage with other breeders in the country to promote and develop the breed further.
- Our MALP weighings continued this week. Mature ewe weights were recorded on the farms located in the West. Mating is underway on most of these farms at this point. We will hope to use this valuable weight information to strengthen our Maternal Index. Currently we are predicting ewe mature weights based on weaning weights taken from ewe lambs. There is a high correlation between this weight and later mature weight. Recording the actual mature weights will hopefully verify this correlation.
- ♣ On Tuesday night we also met with our MALP farmers carrying out Single Sire Mating (SSM) on their flocks this mating season. The aim of this intuitive is to reduce the expense of assigning accurate parentage to each lamb born in the MALP scheme. This is currently being done by DNA. The SSM protocol involves mating groups of ewes to a single ram for the first breeding cycle (14-17 days), lambs are then tagged at birth allowing us to definitively identify parentage of each lamb born. Lambs conceived outside of the first breeding cycle will be identified by DNA as normally done so on our MALP farms.

### 5 Genetic Evaluations

- The monthly beef evaluation for linear scored animals has commenced. New proofs will be uploaded to the database next week and GROW reports sent out to breeders later in the week.
- New test runs for maternal weaning weight have been completed and will be circulated to the industry for feedback.
- ♣ Genomic proofs based on the new fertility proofs are almost complete and will be made available next week.
