3 HerdPlus

The HerdPlus team marked its first year anniversary at the Ploughing this year. We used the event to launch the new **HerdPlus Beef Service**. The €uro-Star Report is the cornerstone of the beef service – it gives a Suckler Beef Value (SBV) score and a corresponding Star rating for each animal in the herd. (Ref last weeks update and this weeks Irish Farmers Journal for further on the €uro-Star). €uro-Star Reports were sent to beef farmers prior to the ploughing so they could come along to our stand and discuss their own details with our staff.

The new Guro-Star system was received well and there was good acceptance that the ratings received were by and large reflective of the animal's performance. As more data flows into the beef herds (particularly sire info) then the faster the overall genetic gain of the national beef herd. As you can see from the photos above, our team were kept busy serving both existing Dairy clients and new Beef clients with their breeding information.


4 MINISTER COUGHLAN ANNOUNCES INCREASED FUNDING TO ICBF FOR BEEF CATTLE BREEDING

On 25th September, The Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Mary Coughlan TD, today announced additional financial support of €450,000 to the Irish Cattle Breeding Federation (ICBF) for beef cattle breeding. This funding is additional to the almost €2 million already committed to ICBF for 2007.

The Minister said that she is more than encouraged by the progress ICBF is making on beef cattle breeding in co-operation with the various stakeholders involved in the industry. Following a meeting which the Minister had with ICBF last week, she is satisfied that huge progress is being made in this area.

The launch of HerdPlus for beef by ICBF at the Ploughing Championships this week is indicative of the progress being made on the beef side and represents a major step forward for suckler herd owners and the beef industry generally. HerdPlus will include *Quro-Star* reports which will reflect the economic breeding values for individual animals and for the herd in the same way as the Economic Breeding Index (EBI) is used in dairy cattle breeding.

The Minister stated that beef cattle breeding is a long term investment and is very important in improving the quality, profitability and competitiveness of Irish beef production. This extra financial support will enable ICBF to progress further beef cattle breeding and she added: "I look forward to seeing Tully re-open in the near future to ensure that the best of the 2007 Spring born pedigree beef calves across the breeds are performance tested."



5 Database Update





- \$49,874 inseminations have been received so far in 2007, compared with 153,342 in 2006 for the same period.
- The new farmer interface to 'HerdPlus' was launched this week. Further updates will be continuing, with a further release expected before Christmas.
- Refinements of the Eurostar reports that were released to suckler farmers will begin next week based on good, constructive feedback received.
- Progress continues on the redesign of the Animal Events file processing which will be completed over the coming months.


International beef
