1 Important Dates

- **↓ ICBF Board Meeting** Thursday 15th September, 10:30 to 14:00 ICBF, Highfield House, Bandon.
- **Sheep Ireland Board Meeting** − Thursday 22nd September, 14:00 to 16:30 − ICBF, Highfield House, Bandon.

2 Breeding Consultation Meeting

The key actions arising from this week's meetings included:

- ♣ For dairy linear scoring:
 - Dairy linear scoring should move to an across breed basis, based on the Holstein system and priority is to be given to collecting data on other breeds in Gene Ireland herds from 2011.
 - ICBF are to develop and implement dairy linear trait genetic evaluations in early 2012 including participation in Interbull evaluations for the main dairy breeds.
 - A dairy linear trait research project should be initiated forthwith to examine a range of questions relevant to genetic evaluations and linear scoring.
- A new "5%" rule for determining which animals qualify for genomic evaluations is to be implemented and:
 - Options are to be investigated to allow farmers to know in advance if an animal will pass the 5% rule.
 - Important outcrosses that won't make the rule can still be tested through the GI scheme.
- Operations work for genomic evaluations of linear type traits is scheduled for the end of September.
- ♣ Proceed with rolling out Friesian Genomic EBI for August 2011.
- **♣** For the new dairy fertility evaluations:
 - Test proofs will be available next week with feedback welcome.
 - Data to be submitted to the September Interbull test run and results presented at the next industry meeting.
- ♣ For the Beef Breeding Review:
 - The outcome of the work underway as part of the review will be updated at a technical meeting with the Herdbooks on 18th of August and also at the Industry consultation meeting on 7th of September.
 - This will include the work being carried out on the cost benefit analysis of beef genetic improvement options by Peter Amer.
- ♣ For ICAR 2012:
 - All participants at the meeting are to keep the week Monday 28th May to Friday 1st June free for 2012.
 - Attendance is recommended for board members of all Irish cattle breeding organisations.
 - More details available at www.icar2012.ie.
- For the new beef maternal weaning weight and fertility traits:
 - The new test proofs will be circulated to all who have not yet received them.
 - An update will be given at a technical meeting with the Herdbooks on 18th of August.










- A list of the 3,408 bulls that have been chosen to be genotyped in 2011, for beef genomics research, is to be circulated to all relevant stakeholders.

 - All attendees to give further thought to the issues and best solutions. These to be further considered at herd book and consultation meetings.



- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFF AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2010 born calves with meal introduced is 626,584 with the number of animals weaned at 565,141.
- 4 A significant block of work to further enhance the efficiency of generation and distribution of Suckler Scheme form is nearing completion.
- The first prototype of a new cattle weighing scales with blue-tooth integration to ICBF handheld software is being shipped from the US today.
- Work is on-going in building the systems that will support the up-coming national BVD eradication programme.
- ♣ Some minor revisions to the Co-op milk solids reports have been completed this week.
- Some further work on the screens to support the transfer of genotypes to and from the ICBF database is on-going.
- This week, the work continued on a major upgrade to one of the key software platforms used at ICBF. The tool used to generate our farmer forms and reports, (Streamserve), will undergo a major upgrade over the coming months.

- 4 625 Commercial animals were weighed and scored in June (up by 36 on June 2010).
