




1 Important Dates

2 Database



- **4** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2011 born calves with meal introduced is 629,773 with the number of animals weaned at 564,398.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. Around 571,000 tissue tags for BVD testing have been purchased at this stage. Around 406,000 samples have been returned at this stage, with a 0.60% BVD Virus Positive rate.
- Work on the changes in how the Beef Eurostars are presented on ICBF outputs (Bull search, reports, web outputs, catalogues, etc.) have begun on the back of two meetings of the Eurostar implementation group.
- Work is continuing on the back-end ICBF web infrastructure with a view to making it more standardised and robust.
- The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2012compared with 2011.



3 **GROW**[®]

- 4 541 Pedigree animals were weighed and scored in May (up by 119 from May 2011).
- 4 181 Commercial animals were weighed and scored in May (down by 202 from May 2011).

4 Sheep Ireland

- The shop window of all that is good about the Irish sheep industry takes place in Athenry, Co. Galway, tomorrow the 30th June. Sheep 2012 will gather all involved in the sector and this will be a major opportunity for Sheep Ireland to continue educating pedigree and commercial farmers as to the potential of genetic improvement in this country. There will be a huge number of exhibits on show, including the national

5 InterBeef
