
2. WCGALP - World Congress of Genetics Applied to Livestock Production


This conference is held every four years and meets next week in Leipzig, Germany. Ireland will be represented by Scientists from Teagasc, the Universities and ICBF. As the name suggests this congress is focused on the application of the science of genetics to the main farm animal species. It is expected that some 1,500 people will be in attendance.

Irish scientists are contributing some ten papers covering a range of subjects including many of those discussed at the recent Cattle Breeding Consultation meetings. It is important that our scientists are able to meet with their international counterparts to compare notes and for their research to be critically examined. These exchanges are very productive.


During this meeting we will also be meeting with scientists who are contributing to Interbeef and we will be briefing countries interested in the IGenoP project. The IGenoP project is targeted at facilitating the development of more accurate genomic evaluations through the sharing of genotypes and expertise.

4. Genetic Evaluations

- 4 Routine evaluations are currently on-going. Files have been prepared and sent to Interbull.
- Work on various projects including the new fertility evaluations, calving performance etc are on-going.
- Staff from the evaluations office will be attending the World Congress on Genetics Applied to Livestock Production next week. We will have limited access to email during the week but will endeavor for answer queries as quickly as possible.

5. Sheep Ireland

- Wendeen Sheep with €uro-Star evaluations were the first sheep with €uro-Stars to be sold this year at their premier sale held in Roscommon mart on Wednesday 21st July. A ram with 5 Stars for 'Production' won the championship. Bred by G & Y Johnston, Tyrrelaspass, Co. Westmeath, he was sold for €630.
- The Charolais Premier sale will be held tomorrow at Tullow Mart. This sale includes 21 sheep with €uro-Star evaluations.
- The Belclare Breed is 100% involved in Sheep Ireland with all Breeders recording in the scheme. They will have €uro-Stars in a catalogue for all sheep at their sale in Kilkenny Mart next Tuesday at 1pm.
- **↓** The Suffolk breed will then have their premier sale in Roscrea mart on Saturday 7th August. They have a very high entry of indexed sheep with 62 sheep with €uro-Stars out of the 180 entered.
- **↓** The Texel premier sale will be held on 14th of August in Blessington mart (11am). €uro-Star evaluations will be available on the sheep that were recorded through Sheep Ireland for this sale also.
