



#### 2 Tully

- A group of 16 beef farmers from Kerry visited Tully today and were impressed.
- A group of Limousin breeders from Wales will visit Tully on Saturday.
- Timothy Byrne an Agricultural student from New Zealand started his 8-month placement on Monday.
- Inspection of bulls for the September intake will be finished by Thursday next week and health testing will be carried out by the local vets from the 12<sup>th</sup> of September. All bulls will be in Tully by the 26<sup>th</sup> of September.

### 3 Database Update

- 25 New Herds added to the database in the past week.
- 5,053 Teagasc ICBF permission forms have now been returned by Teagasc clients.
- The first of the linear scoring hand-helds with the new application will be issued next week. Testing has been progressing well.
- The calving reports for both dairy and beef have been re-run and are now available on the ICBF website for farmers/advisors to download.
- Work is continuing on developing the sale and show catalogue functionality and putting it into a self-service package for farmers.
- Both 'Missing Beef Sire' reports and 'Beef Cows in Milk Recording' reports are continuing to be returned at a very solid rate – this data is being loaded on a daily basis to the database





 Work has begun on the expected calving report which will be issued to farmers upon return of the Breeding Chart. FREEPOST envelopes will be posted to all farmers who got breeding charts next week, in order to encourage the return of the breeding charts.

#### **Industry Test Turnaround Time August 2005**

Industry national average for August was 6.72 days. (July was 6.55). The Industry average is hovering between 6-7 days over the last few months. For August, Kerry, SWS and Dairygold were all under 6 days turnaround with Kerry coming out best with an average of 5.33 days. #### **Electronic DIY Update**

#### Test Rig

This week ICBF commissioned the Fast Flow Test rig (FFTR) for checking the Tru Test Electronic meter. Each meter in the country from Wexford to Donegal is tracked via its own serial number. A schedule is being developed so that over the next few weeks every meter will get its annual service (seals replaced etc) and put through the rig to ensure its reading per manufacturer's spec. #### **Connacht Gold & EDIY**

In July 2005 representatives from Connacht Gold asked ICBF to look at what we could do to offer EDIY Milk Recording to their suppliers. To assess market interest we sent out information packs this week to all Connacht Gold suppliers over 40,000gals that were not Milk Recording to date. We will follow up by offering one or two tests this year to any interested farmers. This will serve two purposes for these farmers;

- They will be trained in readiness for 2006 season (autumn is a good time to train as the herd is relatively stable as opposed to the busy time of next spring).
- With two tests under their belt in 2005 these farmers' cows will get EBIs ahead of the breeding season in 2006.

#### 5 Genetic Evaluations

- Data for participation in the Interbull test evaluations for SCC and longevity was submitted this week.
- Analysis of the latest EBI figures including changes made to fertility and survival, and the addition of SCC to the index are currently ongoing and results will be presented at the Dairy Industry Meeting next week.
- Work on the new Animal Model test proofs for beef and carcass traits has been completed.
   Approximately 250,000 records on 33 breeds were used in the evaluation. New proofs on over 1900 AI bulls have been released to the industry.

#### 6 Beef Linear Scoring & Weight Recording

#### **Linear Scoring Workshop**

- On 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> of August, a Linear Scoring 'Training and Referencing' session was held at Tully. Females were also scored on a nearby pedigree herd. All ten Beef Linear Scorers took part in the session.
- The Scorers spent the first day scoring male and female pedigree beef cattle from a variety of breeds and discussing the results with each other.
- On the second day the scorers were examined for; 1. Repeatability, 2. Harmonization, 3. Use of Scale.
- The Scorers also completed a session on the scoring of Breed Specific Traits.
- Suggestions as to how the overall Linear Scoring Service could be improved were also received from the group.


